#### 1. HAMAS POLITICAL CHIEF ISMAIL HANIYEH ASSASSINATED IN IRAN

- ➤ Hamas said its political leader Ismail Haniyeh has been killed in an overnight strike in the Iranian capital Tehran, a major development that throws the war between Israel and the militant group into an unpredictable and dangerous new phase.
- ➤ He is the second leader of an Iran-backed group reported to have been assassinated in the last day, following the killing of Hezbollah's most senior military commander in Lebanon.
- > Haniyeh's death is, both strategically and symbolically, a dramatic blow to Hamas, eliminating its most public figure who headed up the group's political operations while living overseas.
- 2. ANNUAL LEADERSHIP SUMMIT OF QUAD COUNTRIES TO BE HOSTED BY INDIA IN 2024
- 3. 24 NEW SITES INCLUDED IN UNESCO HERITAGE LIST AT NEW DELHI MEETING
  - Now, 1,223 heritage sites of the world are included in the UNESCO Heritage list, of which 952 are included under the cultural category, 231 under natural and 40 under mixed category.
  - ➤ Italy leads the list with 60 sites, followed by China with 59 sites.
  - India has 43 sites on the list, the latest being the Moidams of Assam, the Mound-Burial System of the Ahom Dynasty.
  - ➤ At the New Delhi meeting, the World Heritage Committee removed Niokolo-Koba National Park in Senegal from the List of World Heritage in Danger.

- > Turkey's parliament approved a move to euthanise some of the country's four million stray dogs those who are sick or deemed aggressive
- > The government says the euthanasia clause is needed to prevent dog attacks and the spread of rabies.
- It says the other homeless dogs should be captured en masse, placed in animal shelters and put up for adoption.

## 7. ADB PROVIDES \$200 MILLION LOAN FOR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT IN INDIA

- ➤ The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has committed a \$200 million (approximately Rs 1,700 crore) loan to improve solid waste management and sanitation in 100 cities across eight states in India.
- ➤ This funding is part of the **Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0** Comprehensive Municipal Waste Management in Indian Cities Program.

#### 8. INDIAN GOVERNMENT DONATES \$85 MILLION TO WHO'S GTMC JAMNAGAR

➤ The Ministry of Ayush, Government of India, has signed an agreement with the World Health Organisation (WHO) of the United Nations to provide \$85 million to the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre (GTMC) in Jamnagar, Gujarat, over a 10-year period (2022-2032).



> Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of the GCTM on 19 April 2022 in Jamnagar in the presence of WHO Director Tedross Ghebreyesus and Mauritian Prime Minister Pravind Kumar Jugnauth.

#### INDIA ANNOUNCES \$300 MILLION LOAN TO VIETNAM DURING VIETNAM PM VISIT

- > The government of India has announced two loans totalling \$300 million to Vietnam during the visit of the Prime Minister of Vietnam, Pham Minh Chinh.
- The loan is for strengthening Vietnam's maritime security.
- > Nine agreements were signed between India and Vietnam during the visit of the Vietnamese Prime Minister Pham Minh Chinh. During the visit, it was announced that Vietnam will join the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI).

- > India and the United States of America have signed a Cultural Property Agreement to stop the illegal trade in Indian antiquities in the United States of America (USA).
- > The agreement was signed on the sidelines of the 46th session of the World Heritage Committee of the United Nations Cultural and Educational Organizations (UNESCO) in New Delhi
- > Since 1976, India has repatriated 358 antiquities, of which 345 have been retrieved since 2014.

#### 13. PM MODI PRAISES PARIMAL NATHWANI'S BOOK 'CALL OF THE GIR' ON ASIATIC LIONS & CONSERVATION **EFFORTS**

- > Prime Minister Narendra Modi has appreciated the book 'Call of the Gir' written by Rajya Sabha Member Parimal Nathwani.
- The book combines vivid photography and narratives to highlight the urgency of conservation efforts.

#### 14. G-20 ACCEPTS BRAZIL'S "BILLIONARIE TAX" PROPOSAL

- > Zucman's proposal, commissioned by Brazil, calls for a 2% minimum tax that would hit about 3,000 of the world's richest people.
- > idea it sees as vital to planetary battles against poverty and climate change the primary aims of Brazil's first stint as the G-20's leader.
- > That tax aims to ensure that multinational firms pay a minimum rate regardless of their jurisdiction. If a corporation pays less than 15% tax on profits in one country, other nations can charge a so-called top-up levy.

#### 16. BANGLADESH PM SHEIKH HASINA RESIGNS, ENDING 15 YEARS IN POWER

> Bangladesh experienced a monumental shift in its political landscape. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who had held power for 15 consecutive years, abruptly tendered her resignation and left the country

#### **Origins of the Unrest**

The seeds of discontent that led to Hasina's downfall were sown in July 2024. The government announced a controversial quota system for government jobs, giving preference to families of freedom fighters - those who fought for Bangladesh's independence in 1971. This decision reignited long-standing debates about merit, fairness, and the

legacy of the independence movement. > Despite an initial ruling by the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court to dismiss the quota order, protests continued to gain momentum. The situation

was further inflamed when Prime Minister Hasina referred to the protesting students as 'razakar' (traitors), a highly charged term in Bangladesh's political lexicon.

#### 17. BANGLADESH PRESIDENT ORDERS RELEASE OF EX-PM KHALEDA ZIA People's Republic of Bangladesh

- Bangladesh is a neighbouring country of India. It gained Independence from Pakistan in 1971 after the India-Pakistan war.
- India shares its longest international boundary, 4097 km, with Bangladesh.
- West Bengal, Tripura, Assam, Meghalaya and Mizoram share a boundary with Bangladesh.
- Bangladesh is one of the most densely populated countries in the world.





#### 18. IRAN-ISRAEL WAR: WAR ATTACK SITUATION AMID IRAN AND ISRAEL

- > US Secretary of State Antony Blinken has warned that Iran and Hezbollah may attack Israel within the next 24 to 48 hours.
- Immediately following the assassination of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh
- India's instance on Iran Israel War: South Block quickly issued a statement expressing India's "serious concern" at the escalation of hostilities, and called for "immediate de-escalation"

#### 19. TURKEY BLOCKS INSTAGRAM AMID 'CENSORSHIP' ROW

- > Turkey blocked access to Instagram for its 85 million people, the country's Information and Communication Technologies Authority announced.
- > The ban was a response to the platform removing posts related to the death of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh.

## 20. PRESIDENT MURMU OFFICIAL VISIT TO FIJI, NEW ZEALAND AND TIMOR LESTE

- For the first time, an Indian President will visit Fiji and Timor Leste.
- The visit is part of the Indian government's Act East policy announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- ➤ The policy aims to promote economic, cultural and strategic ties with the countries of the Indo-Pacific region.

#### 21. ASHMA KUMARI KC CROWNED AS MISS NEPAL WORLD 2024

- Ashma Kumari KC was crowned Miss Nepal World 2024 in the 28th edition beauty pageant
- Sumana KC and Karuna Rawat won the titles of Miss Nepal Earth and Miss Nepal International, respectively.



- India is a founder member of the IMF. India has the eighth largest quota-2.75% in the IMF. India has a voting share of 2.63% in the IMF.

- > These grants, aimed at fostering Australia-India collaboration, encompass sustainable manufacturing, energy transition research, and artistic projects
- > The Maitri grants, administered by the Centre for Australia-India Relations, aim to deepen links and allow for closer collaboration between the two countries.
- > The five Maitri Research Grants will explore opportunities in agribusiness, critical technology, energy transition, and advanced manufacturing.
- 28. PRESIDENT DROUPADI MURMU ADDRESSES THE NEW ZEALAND INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION CONFERENCE IN WELLINGTON

#### 29. SHEIKH HASINA ACCUSES US OF OUSTING HER FOR REFUSING TO SURRENDER SAINT MARTIN ISLAND

- > She claims the US wanted to assert control over the Bay of Bengal through this action. Hasina alleges that she could have remained in power if she had surrendered the island.
- ➤ Hasina justified her resignation as a means to avoid further violence and urged Bangladeshi citizens not to fall prey to the radical manipulation. She also expressed sorrow over the ongoing violence and killings of political leaders in Bangladesh.





#### 30. PRESIDENT MURMU RECEIVES THE HIGHEST CIVILIAN AWARD OF TIMOR LESTE

- > President Droupadi Murmu was honoured with the highest civilian award of Timor Leste Grand Collar of Order of Timor Leste, by Timor Leste President Jose Ramos Horta.
- President Murmu is the first Indian President to visit Timor Leste.

#### **Timor Leste**

- Timor Leste, which was earlier known as East Timor, is an island country in Southeast Asia.
- It was a Portuguese colony till 1975, and after the withdrawal of the Portuguese, it was occupied by Indonesia.

## 31. SRI LANKA - INDIA FRIENDSHIP ARCH INAUGURATED AS PART OF PLANT4MOTHER CAMPAIGN

- Indian High Commissioner to Sri Lanka, Santosh Jha and Sri Lankan Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardana, inaugurated the 'Sri Lanka – India Friendship Arch' at the National Sandalwood Garden
- > The event was a part of the 'Plant4Mother' campaign launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.



#### 32. FAST TRACKING BIMSTEC FREE TRADE AGREEMENT

- There should be a focus on reducing trade deficit, strengthening of trade facilitation measures to strengthen partnership in e-commerce, digital public infrastructure and better integration of custom borders with the aid of technology.
- The **Minister noted** that there is a need for **computerisation of border controls**, faster clearances of the import-export online application processes which **will help in Ease of Doing Business**.

#### BIMSTEC(Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation)

- BIMSTEC (Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation) is a regional organization which was founded as BIST-EC (Bangladesh India Sri Lanka and Thailand Economic Cooperation) on 6 June 1997.
- Initially, it consisted of Bangladesh, India, Sri Lanka, and Thailand. In **1997**, it was expanded to include Myanmar. In **2004**, Nepal and Bhutan joined the organisation, taking the total membership of the BIMSTEC to seven.

#### 33. BILL GATES FOUNDATION TO SET UP FSTP AT SAROVARAM

- ➤ The city of Kozhikode in Kerala, India, is set to receive a significant upgrade to its waste management infrastructure. Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, in collaboration with the Habitat Charitable Trust, has proposed the construction of a state-of-the-art faecal sludge treatment plant (FSTP) at Sarovaram.
- ➤ This development marks a crucial step towards **improving sanitation and** water hygiene in the region.

- ➤ India and the Maldives have renewed their Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to bolster the training of Maldivian civil servants.
- ➤ The renewed MoU, spanning from 2024 to 2029, will facilitate the training of an additional 1,000 civil service officers from the Maldives.

## 38. GERMAN SCIENTISTS DISCOVER PLASTIC-EATING FUNGI FOR WASTE REDUCTION

- It could offer a hope in tackling the problem of millions of tonnes of waste polluting the world's oceans every year.
- Microfungi can degrade synthetic polymers, showing potential for use in controlled environments like sewage treatment plants. However, they are unlikely to solve the global plastic waste crisis. (350-400 million metric tons)





#### 39. AUSTRALIA, U.S., U.K. SIGN NUCLEAR TRANSFER DEAL FOR AUKUS SUBMARINES

- > Australia had signed a deal to allow the exchange of nuclear secrets and material with the United States and Britain, a key step toward equipping its navy with nuclear-powered submarines.
- > It is a trilateral security partnership between the United Kingdom, the United States of America, and Australia agreed in 2021.
- AUKUS is a trilateral security pact between Australia, the United Kingdom, and the United States, announced on 15 September 2021 for the Indo-Pacific region.
- > The pact will focus on military capability, separating it from the Five Eyes intelligence-sharing alliance that also includes New Zealand and Canada.
- > Under the pact, the US and the UK will assist Australia in acquiring nuclear-powered submarines.
- > The security grouping AUKUS will focus on advancing strategic interests in the Indo-Pacific region
- It is often described as the world's most successful intelligence alliance.

#### 40. YOUTH AROUND THE WORLD FIND IT TOUGH TO GET A JOB: ILO REPORT

- > Young people around the world are unable to find secure work and their chances of finding a job decrease as the income level of the country they reside in decreases, the International Labour Organisation's (ILO) Global Employment Trends for Youth 2024 report.
- ➤ The number of 15 to 24-year-olds who are not in employment, education or training (NEET) is concerning and that the post-COVID-19 pandemic employment recovery has not been universal.

- > Germany's recent inclusion in the **U.S.-led United Nations Command (UNC)** in South Korea marks a significant expansion of the command's member states, now totaling **18 nations**.
- > This move underscores Berlin's commitment to global security, linking European stability to the broader Indo-Pacific region.

#### 45. PM MODI TO HEADLINE THE ET WORLD LEADERS FORUM

- > The forum aims to address India's role in global economic growth, innovation, and policy-making amidst a backdrop of global economic stagnation.

#### 46. UN HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO VISIT BANGLADESH TO INVESTIGATE HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS

- A human rights team from the United Nations will visit Dhaka next week to discuss with the Bangladesh interim government, investigations into the human rights violations during the recent unrest in Bangladesh.
- > The team visiting Bangladesh will discuss with the interim government areas of support and the modalities for an investigation of human rights violations in the context of the recent violence and unrest.

#### 48. INDIA AND ISRAEL LAUNCH NEW WATER TECHNOLOGY CENTRE AT IIT-MADRAS

This tripartite agreement is signed by the Embassy of Israel, IIT Madras, and the AMRUT mission of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs



- > The Center of Water Technology aims to become a hub for innovation, research, and capacity-building in water technologies, particularly focusing on sustainable solutions for urban water supply.
- > To kickstart this initiative, a capacity-building course on '24/7 Water Supply in Urban Areas' was organised at IIT-Madras.

#### 49. MAITRI UTASAV IN SRI LANKA TO MARK INDIA'S INDEPENDENCE DAY

- > The cultural wing of the Indian High Commission in Sri Lanka, Swami Vivekananda Cultural Centre is organising Bharat Sri Lanka Maitri Utsav to commemorate India's Independence Day.
- At the Independence Square in Colombo.
- > The four-day-long event will feature a handicraft fair, a food festival and cultural performances.

#### 50. SUDAN DECLARES CHOLERA OUTBREAK, WHO REPORTS 316 DEATHS

- > Cholera is an acute diarrhoeal infection caused by eating or drinking food or water that is contaminated with the bacterium Vibrio cholerae.
- Cholera causes severe diarrhea and dehydration.
- > The disease is most common in places with poor sanitation, crowding, war, and famine. Cholera outbreaks are more common in warm climates.
- Can lead to death if left untreated.

#### Treatment:

Currently, there are three WHO pre-qualified oral cholera vaccines (OCV), Dukoral, Shanchol, and **Euvichol-Plus.** 

#### Treatment for cholera can include:

- Rehydration therapy
- **Antibiotics**
- Zinc supplementation for children

#### 51. WHO DECLARES MPOX AS PHEIC FOR THE SECOND TIME

- > The World Health Organization (WHO) Director General, Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, declared mpox (monkeypox) disease a "public health emergency of international concern (PHEIC)" after an upsurge in the mpox case in the Democratic Republic of Congo and other African countries.
- > This is the second time that mpox has been declared as PHEIC by WHO. Earlier in July 2022 it was declared as PHEIC by the WHO.

#### **52. SHIVELUCH VOLCANO IN RUSSIA ERUPTS**

- Shiveluch volcano in Russia erupted after a 7.0 magnitude earthquake that struck off the eastern coast of the country.
- > Shiveluch, also called Sheveluch, which originates from the name "suelich" which means "smoking mountain" in Itelmen is the northernmost active volcano in Kamchatka Krai, Russia.

#### 53. 3RD INDIA JAPAN 2+2 MINISTERIAL DIALOGUE HELD IN NEW DELHI

- The 2+2 Dialogue is a mechanism for both countries to discuss bilateral, regional, and global issues of mutual importance. It was started in 2019 to deepen and enhance India and Japan's security and defence cooperation.
- India and Japan share close ties and will celebrate the 10th year of their Special Strategic and Global Partnership in 2024.

#### India-Japan 2+2 Dialogue

- During the 13th India-Japan Annual Summit meeting in Japan in October 2018, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe decided to start a 2+2 meeting of their foreign and Defence Ministers to deepen and institutionalise bilateral security and defence cooperation.
- The **first India-Japan** 2+2 dialogue was held in New Delhi in November 2019.
- The **second India-Japan** 2+2 dialogue was held in Tokyo, Japan, in September 2022.

#### 54. U.S. NAVY DEPLOYS LONG-RANGE MISSILES TO COUNTER CHINA

- ➤ The US Navy has introduced the AIM-174B, an extremely long range air-toair missile, in the Indo-Pacific, aiming to counter China's aerial dominance.
- > The defence missile is now the longest-range missile ever fielded by the US.
- Capable of striking targets up to 400 km (250 miles) away, it surpasses the range of China's PL-15 missile, providing US jets a critical edge in aerial engagements.







#### 55. INDIA-SRILANKA FERRY SERVICE RESUMES BETWEEN NAGAPATTINAM AND KANKESANTHURAI NEAR JAFFNA

- India overtook China as the world's biggest importer of Russian oil in July as Chinese refiners bought less because of lower profit margins from producing fuels, a comparison of import data showed.
- Russian crude made up a record 44% of India's overall imports last month, rising to a record 2.07 million barrels per day (bpd), 4.2% higher than in June and 12% more than a year ago,

#### 2. CENTRE CLEARS URBAN FLOOD MANAGEMENT PROJECTS WORTH ₹2,514.36 CR OF 5 STATES

➤ The High-Level Committee in today's meeting approved six project proposals in the states of Telangana, Gujarat, Karnataka, West Bengal and Maharashtra at a total cost of Rs. 2514.36 crore for Urban Flood Management in six metro cities, namely Mumbai, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad and Pune.

#### 3. EDUCATION MINISTER LAUNCHES NATS 2.0 AND DISBURSES RS. 100 CRORE STIPENDS

- Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has launched the National Apprenticeship and Training Scheme (NATS) 2.0 portal and disbursed Rs. 100 crore in stipends to apprentices via Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT).
- The initiative aims to enhance employability skills for young graduates and diploma holders across various sectors, including IT, manufacturing, and automobiles

#### 4. ICG LAUNCHES 'SUVIDHA SOFTWARE VERSION 1.0' TO ENHANCE TRAINING PROTOCOLS

- ➤ The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) unveiled its new 'Suvidha Software Version 1.0' during the inaugural 'Annual Operational Sea Training Conference' held in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh, .
- This advanced software aims to improve training protocols and maintain consistency across all ICG platforms.



#### 5. INDIAN ARMY LAUNCHES E-SEHAT TELE-CONSULTANCY FOR VETERANS

- The Ex-Servicemen Contributory Health Scheme (ECHS) has introduced the Electronic Services e-Health Assistance and Tele-consultation (E-SeHAT) module.
- > This initiative allows ECHS beneficiaries to receive online medical consultations from their homes, eliminating the need to visit ECHS Polyclinics.
- The pilot phase of E-SeHAT has been initiated at **12 ECHS Polyclinics**, including those in remote locations such as Baramulla, Imphal, Churachandpur, Dimapur, and Aizawal

#### 6. UNION MINISTER BHUPENDRA YADAV LAUNCHES "IDEAS4LIFE INITIATIVE" AT IIT DELHI

- > Ideas4LiFE is set up to gather creative ideas and innovations online that can inspire people to live more sustainably.
- It supports Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of using resources wisely.
- > The program invites students, researchers, teachers, and innovators to share their ideas. It seeks to create a culture of innovation focused on protecting the environment.

#### INDIA'S FIRST INTEGRATED AGRI-EXPORT FACILITY TO COME UP AT JAWAHARLAL NEHRU PORT

- ➤ Shipping Minister Sarbananda Sonowal approved an Rs 284.19 crore integrated agri-export facility project at Jawaharlal Nehru Port in Mumbai.
- ➤ It aims to reduce multiple handlings of agricultural products- By centralizing the export process; the facility will minimize the need for multiple handlings of products. This will reduce the risk of damage and loss during transit.



- 8. MAZHOTSAVAM, A FESTIVAL TO CELEBRATE- THE MONSOON AND UNDERSTAND IT
  - A two-day rain festival to be held on the banks of the Bharathapuzha, kerela celebrates the rain and the river and hopes to revive the traditional, cultural and environmental practices surrounding the monsoon.

#### 9. EXCLUDE 'CREAMY LAYER' FROM SC, ST RESERVATIONS, RULES SUPREME COURT

- > The Supreme Court ruled that states must identify the 'creamy layer' within the SCs and STs and exclude them from quota benefits.
- ➤ The Supreme Court also ruled by a majority judgment that sub-classification within the SC and STs Reservation is permissible; overruling the earlier order in the EV Chinnaiah matter that sub-classification was not permissible as SC/STs form "homogenous classes".

#### What is a 'creamy layer' within castes and tribes?

'Creamy layer' are a category of persons within reserved categories – scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in this case – that are **economically and socially advanced.** 

#### 10. KASHMIR, 4TH INDIAN CITY TO RECEIVE WORLD CRAFT CITY CERTIFICATE

- > 4th Indian city to get a World Craft City certificate
- ➤ Kashmir is the fourth Indian city to be included in the World Craft City list of the World Crafts Council.
- Jaipur of Rajasthan and Mamallapuram in Tamil Nadu was included in 2015, and Mysore in Karnataka was included in 2018.





While Jaipur, Mamallapuram, and Kashmir have received the World Craft City tag, Mamallapuram has been recognised for its stone craft (World Craft City for Stone Carving).

#### 11. WOMEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM LAUNCHED

- In a pivotal move towards **empowering women entrepreneurs** and spurring economic growth, the **National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)** unveiled the **Women Entrepreneurship Program.**
- This program is designed to address the distinct challenges that women face when starting and growing businesses.
- Partnership with Britannia Industries Limited

#### 12. TELANGANA SAYS 'WILL BE FIRST STATE' TO IMPLEMENT SC QUOTA SUB-CLASSIFICATION AFTER ORDER

- > The state government will take appropriate measures to implement the reservations for Madigas and other subcastes in the current job notification as well.
- Madigas are the largest among the 59 SC sub-castes in Telangana followed by the Malas.

#### 13. CBSE LAUNCHES SAFAL TEST CYCLE 2024 WITH A PLAN TO REDUCE EXAM STRESS

It aims to develop a first-of-its-kind "census" on learning gaps to help plan timely remedial action.

#### **Key Features:**

- It is a Competency-based Assessment for Grades 3, 5 and 8 that assesses core concepts, application of knowledge and higher order thinking skills.
- It will test proficiency of students at 4 levels of skills and knowledge Below Basic (2 years below Grade), Basic (1 year below Grade), Proficient and Advanced (Current Grade).

## 14. CEA APPROVES HYDRO-PUMPED STORAGE PLANT IN ODISHA AND KARNATAKA

- Under the provisions of the Electricity Act 2003, any company intending to set up a hydro-generating station requires the concurrence of the Central Electricity Authority
- ➤ The 2000 MW Sharavathy Hydro-Pumped Storage plant is being developed on the **river Sharavathy** in the **Shimoga district** of Karnataka.
- ➤ The Rs 8000 crore 2000 MW Sharavathy project is the country's largest pump storage power generation unit. This mega project, backed by the government of Karnataka, is expected to solve the state's power crisis.



- > The 600 MW Upper Indravati Pumped Storage Plant will be built in the Kalahandi district of Odisha.
- > It will be **built on the Indravati River near the existing Indravati Hydel project** and will use the released water of the Upper Indravati Reservoir.

- ➤ Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh announced in the Rajya Sabha that the Union Government has introduced a new Electronic Human Resource Management System (e-HRMS).
- > This system aims to streamline and enhance the management of government employees' service matters through digital means.

#### 18. HINDUSTAN ZINC LAUNCHES ASIA'S FIRST GREEN ZINC BRAND "ECOZEN"

- ➤ Hindustan Zinc's EcoZen and other zinc products find their primary application in galvanization of steel for corrosion resistance.
- Produced using renewable energy, EcoZen has a carbon footprint of less than 1 tonne of carbon equivalent per tonne of zinc produced, about 75% lower than the global average
- It is important for its role in sectors such as steel, infrastructure, automotive and sunrise sectors such as renewable energy, electronics, hi-tech manufacturing, energy storage, defence and electric mobility.

#### 19. NPCI RE-ESTABLISHED CONNECTIVITY WITH C-EDGE TECHNOLOGIES AFTER SECURITY REVIEW

- > The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) reestablished the retail payment connections of banks that were using **C-Edge systems** on August 1 after the technology provider was hit by a **ransomware attack**
- > C-Edge, a joint venture between **State Bank of India (SBI) and Tata Consultancy Services (TCS)**, is a **technology service provider** that offers services to cooperative and regional rural banks.

#### 20. GOVT LAUNCHED CASHLESS TREATMENT SCHEME FOR ROAD CRASH VICTIMS

- Ministry of Road Transport & Highways has formulated a scheme and initiated implementation on pilot basis in Chandigarh and Assam to provide cashless treatment to victims of road accidents caused by use of motor vehicle, on any category of road, in collaboration with National Health Authority (NHA).
- > Victims entitled to cashless treatment up to Rs. 1.5 lakhs per accident per person for a maximum period of 7 days from date of accident.
- Applicable to all road accidents caused by use of motor vehicle on any category of road.
- > The National Health Authority (NHA) shall be the implementing agency for the pilot program, in coordination with police, hospitals, State Health Agency (SHA) etc.



> This scheme is managed by the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund, which was established under Section 164B of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.

#### 21. ZOMATO TO LAUNCH NEW APP 'DISTRICT' TO CAPTURE ITS 'GOING-OUT' MARKET

Zomato is launching the 'District' app to consolidate various going-out services like dining, movies, sports ticketing, live performances, shopping, and staycations.

#### 22. NCERT PROPOSES 10 BAGLESS DAYS FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS 6 - 8

- ➤ The National Council for Educational Research and Training (NCERT) released guidelines for the implementation of bagless days for classes 6 to 8 in an effort to make learning in schools more experiential and stress-free.
- Developed by Pandit Sunderlal Sharma Central Institute of Vocational Education, the vocational education unit of the NCERT, the guidelines come after the new National Education Policy (NEP), 2020

#### 23. PRICE MONITORING SYSTEM MOBILE APP 4.0 LAUNCHED TO CURB INFLATION

- ➤ The Ministry of Consumer Affairs launched Version 4.0 of the Price Monitoring System (PMS) Mobile App, adding 16 new commodities for daily price monitoring, totaling 38 items, from 550 centres across 34 States/UTs.
- The price data monitored by the Department provides advance inputs for policy decision for the Government, RBI and analysts regarding the CPI inflation.
- ➤ These includes providing **Bharat Chana Dal at Rs.60 per kg**; **Bharat Atta** at Rs.27.50 per kg and **Bharat Rice** at Rs.29 per kg to the retail consumers.

#### 24. US HAS BECOME SECOND LARGEST SUPPLIER OF LNG IN INDIA

- In 2023, the United States emerged as India's second-largest supplier of Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG), surpassing the United Arab Emirates, delivering 3.09 million tonnes (MT) in 2023.
- Qatar remained the largest supplier with shipments in 2023.

- Airlines carrying human cadaveric organs can request the Air Traffic Control for priority take-off and landing of the aircraft and arrange front-row seats.
- They can also request priority reservation and a provision for late check-in for medical personnel transporting organs.

#### 27. UNION CABINET APPROVED 8 NATIONAL HIGH-SPEED ROAD CORRIDORS

- ➤ The government approved eight national high-speed road corridor projects of length 936 km entailing investment of Rs 50,655 crore to improve logistics efficiency and connectivity across the country.
- > The implementation of these eight important projects will generate an estimated 4.42 crore mandays of direct and indirect employment

#### 28. KHIR-CITY TO BE LAUNCHED IN BENGALURU ON AUG 23

- Karnataka will officially inaugurate its ambitious Knowledge Health Innovation Research-City (KHIR-City)
- A cluster of world-class universities, hospitals, innovative industries, and research institutions, coming up on a parcel of 2,000 acres of land near the Kempegowda International Airport.
- With an estimated investment of over ₹40,000 crore, the entire project is expected to create about 50,000 jobs.

➤ The Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation Amit Shah launched four apps—e-Sakshya, Nyaya Setu, Nyaya Shruti, and e-Summon—to ensure the smooth implementation of the three new criminal laws in the country.

#### **Functions of the four Apps**

 e-Sakshya, all testimonies, videography and photography will be saved on the e-evidence server. It will be available to all the courts on a real-time hasis

- e-Summon app, the courts will electronically send summons to police stations and the concerned person to whom the summons is to be sent.
- Nyaay Setu Dashboard will link the Police, Medical, Forensic, Prosecution and Prison authorities. It will provide the police with all the information related to the investigation on a real-time basis.
- Nyaay Shruti app will enable the court to hear witnesses via videoconferencing.
- Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, replacing the Indian Penal Code 1860,
- . Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, replacing the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and
- Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023, replacing Indian Evidence Act, 1872.

- ➤ **Bob Rae**, Canada's Ambassador to the UN, elected as **ECOSOC President** for a 1-year term, enhancing Canada's bilateral engagements.
- ➤ The United Nations Economic and Social Council is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations, responsible for coordinating the economic and social fields.

#### 32. PM NARENDRA MODI HAILS RECORD GAS PRODUCTION IN COUNTRY

- Our self-reliance in the field of energy is very important in achieving the goal of 'Viksit Bharat'.
- ➤ The gas production in 2020-21 was 28.7 BCM and increased to 36.43 BCM (Billion cubic meters) in 2023-24.
- The country is expected to reach 45.3 BCM gas production by FY26,

## 33. DOPPLER RADAR TO BE INSTALLED IN LAHAUL-SPITI FOR WEATHER FORECASTING

- > X-band Doppler weather radar will be installed in Lahaul-Spiti, Himachal Pradesh, by December 2025 to enhance weather forecasting and disaster management in the region.
- > Radar (Radio Detection and Ranging): a device which uses electromagnetic waves in the microwaves region to detect location (range & direction), altitude, intensity and movement of moving and non-moving objects.
- > Doppler Radar: a specialized radar that uses the Doppler effect to produce velocity data about objects at a distance.
- > Doppler Effect: When the source and the signal are in relative motion to each other there is a change in the frequency observed by the observer. If they are moving closer, frequency increases and vice versa.

#### 34. SUPREME COURT UPHOLDS DELHI L-G'S POWER TO APPOINT ALDERMEN TO MCD

- > The Supreme Court held that the authority of the Lieutenant Governor of Delhi to nominate 10 persons with special knowledge of municipal administration to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi is a statutory duty attached to his office and he is not bound by the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers.
- ➤ A bench of Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud and Justices P S Narasimha and J B Pardiwala, said in its order, "The statutory power under Section 3(3)(b)(i) to nominate persons of special knowledge was vested in the Lt Governor for the first time by the 1993 amendment to the Delhi Municipal Corporation Act, 1957 to incorporate the Constitutional changes through Articles 239AA, 239AB and introduction of Part IX-A relating to municipalities.

#### 35. PM MARKS 5 YEARS OF ABROGATION OF ARTICLES 370 AND 35(A)

- > On the fifth anniversary of the abrogation of Articles 370 and 35(A), Prime Minister Narendra Modi highlighted the decision as a pivotal moment in Indian history, marking the beginning of a new era of progress and prosperity for Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) and Ladakh.
- ➤ He emphasized that the abrogation ensured the full implementation of the Indian Constitution in these regions, aiming to enhance security, dignity, and development opportunities for marginalized communities while reducing corruption.

## 36. NCW LAUNCHES DIGITAL SHAKTI CENTER TO COMBAT CYBERCRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

- ➤ The National Commission for Women (NCW) has inaugurated the Digital Shakti Center in New Delhi to address the rising cybercrimes against women.
- This initiative aims to empower women with cyber safety knowledge, provide support for complaint registration, and create a safe digital environment.

#### National Commission for Women (NCW):

- The NCW is the **statutory body of the Government of India**, generally concerned with **advising the government on all policy matters** affecting women.
- It was **established in January 1992** under the provisions of the Indian Constitution, as defined in the 1990 **National Commission for Women Act.**
- The objective of the NCW is to represent the rights of women in India and to provide a voice for their issues and concerns.
- The subjects of their campaigns have included dowry, politics, religion, equal representation for women in jobs, and the exploitation of women for labour.

#### 37. INDIA TO BUILD GREEN HIGHWAYS WITH WORLD BANK AI

- The Government of India and the World Bank has joined forces to construct the Green National Highway Corridor Project (GNHCP).
- This project aims to build 781 km of eco-friendly highways across four states (Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Andhra Pradesh) with a focus on safety and climate resilience.
- Project Completion Timeline: The GNHCP is scheduled for completion by May 2026.
- The World Bank will provide a loan of US \$500 million for the project, with a total cost of US \$1288.24 million (Rs. 7,662.47 crore).

- > Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya (GSV) has started its first executive training program for the aviation sector at the Asian Institute of Transport Development (AITD) at Dwaraka, New Delhi.
- > The three-day program will be focused on "Safety Management Systems" for working professionals; it is conducted in collaboration with Airbus.

#### 39. MADRAS HIGH COURT DECLARES SECTION 77-A OF REGISTRATION ACT UNCONSTITUTIONAL

> The Madras High Court on Friday declared as unconstitutional Section 77-A of the Registration Act, 1908, on the ground that it conferred excessive quasi-judicial power on the District Registrars to cancel documents related to any immovable property in the State if they were found to have been registered through fraud or on submission of forged revenue records

#### 40. INDIA'S RENEWABLE ENERGY CAPACITY SOARS BY 165% IN A DECADE

- > India's renewable energy capacity has surged by 165% over the past decade, reaching 203.1 GW in 2024.
- > This growth makes India the fourth largest globally in renewable energy capacity, with significant advancements in solar and wind power.

#### 41. RS 920 CR NAMAMI GANGE MISSION 2.0 PROJECTS IN UP AND BIHAR

- The central government has completed and operationalized four major projects of Rs 920 crore in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar under Namami Gange Mission 2.0.
- ➤ These projects will add 145 megaliters per day MLD of sewage treatment capacity and provide better sewer networks.

#### What is Namami Gange Mission?

'Namami Gange Programme', is an Integrated Conservation Mission, approved as 'Flagship Programme' by the
Union Government in June 2014 with budget outlay of Rs.20,000 Crore to accomplish the twin objectives of
effective abatement of pollution, conservation and rejuvenation of National River Ganga.

#### 42. DR MANSUKH MANDAVIYA DIRECTS IMPLEMENTATION OF ELI SCHEME IN MISSION MODE

- > Labour and employment minister Mansukh Mandaviya called for expeditious implementation of the three employment-linked incentive (ELI) schemes in a mission mode.
- > The three schemes were announced in Union Budget 2024-25. Initiatives to facilitate employment, skilling and other opportunities for 41 million youth over a five-year period with a central outlay of Rs 2 lakh crore.
- > EPFO is the nodal body for rolling out the benefits under the three schemes.

#### **ELI Schemes**

The ELI scheme aims to create over two crore jobs in the country in a period of two years.

#### Scheme A:

• Government reimburses one month's wage up to Rs 15,000 in three installments for first-time workforce entrants.

#### Scheme B:

- Focus on bulk hiring in manufacturing.
- Reimbursements: 24%, 24%, 16%, and 8% of the wage, shared equally between employee and employer.
- Employer must hire 50 or 25% of baseline EPFO employee strength and retain them for at least 12 months.

#### Scheme C:

• Government reimburses employer's EPFO share up to Rs 3,000 per month for two years.

#### 43. CJI DY CHANDRACHUD LAUNCHES "E-DHCR" PORTAL

- CJI D Y Chandrachud introduced the E-DHCR, a new portal for accessing reportable judgments of the Delhi High Court.
- e-DHCR portal will offer free access to Delhi High Court judgments, serving as a useful resource for lawyers, litigants, law students, legal enthusiasts, and the general public.





## 44. INDIAN GOVT FOR THE FIRST TIME ALLOWED COMMERCIAL CULTIVATION OF HERBICIDE TOLERANT "HT BASMATI RICE"

'Nandini Sahakar Yojana'

- > The Nandini Sahakar Scheme by NCDC (National Cooperative Development Corporation) is a women-focused framework providing financial assistance, project formulation, and capacity development to women cooperatives.
- Launched under Atmanirbhar Bharat, it aims to improve socio-economic status of women through entrepreneurship.
- There is no limit on financial assistance.

#### 45. PM TO UNVEIL NEW CROP VARIETIES DEVELOPED BY ICAR-CPCRI

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to release two new coconut and two cocoa varieties developed by the ICAR-Central Plantation Crops Research Institute (CPCRI), Kasaragod.
- Two coconut varieties Kalpa Suvarna and Kalpa Shatabdi and two cocoa varieties VTL CH1 and VTL CH2.

#### 46. PMAY- U 2.0 APPROVED BY UNION CABINET WITH 10 LAKH CRORE INVESTMENT

- > The duration of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U) 2.0 is five years.
- > It aims to facilitate the construction of one crore houses in urban areas for the urban poor and middle-class families.
- The Union Ministry of **Housing and Urban Affairs** will be the nodal body for implementing the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U) 2.0 scheme.
- All areas declared as towns by law and mentioned in the 2011 census across the country will be covered.

#### 47. THIRD EDITION OF 'HAR GHAR TIRANGA' CAMPAIGN

- The third edition of the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign will be held from August 9 to August 15 to celebrate Independence Day.
- > The initiative, which encourages citizens to display the national flag and share selfies, aims to promote patriotism and national pride.

## 48. YOUTH CREATES WORLD RECORD FOR PERFORMANCE OF LARGEST-EVER KASHMIRI FOLK DANCE AT 'KASHUR RIWAAJ' CULTURAL FESTIVAL

> Youth of Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district created a world record by registering their names to the Universal Records Forum (URF) for the largest-ever Kashmiri folk dance performed by 10,000 young women at the 'Kashur Riwaaj' cultural festival.

#### 49. COUNTRY'S FIRST PM JANAMAN COLONY BUILT-IN SHIVPURI JANPAD PANCHAYAT

- The PM-JANMAN (comprising Central Sector and Centrally Sponsored Schemes) to focus on 11 critical interventions through 9 Ministries including the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- The scheme aims to provide crucial interventions such as permanent housing, road connectivity, piped water supply, mobile medical units, hostel construction, 'Anganwadi' facilities and skill development centres etc.

#### 50. INDIA'S FIRST GRAIN ATM LAUNCHED IN ODISHA

- ➤ WFP (World Food Programme) and the Government of Odisha launched India's first around the clock grain dispensing machine, the 'Grain ATM,' also known as 'Annapurti', in the state capital Bhubaneshwar.
- Odisha has become the first state in India to provide access to the public distribution system beneficiaries 24 hours a day.
- Annapurti is energy efficient and consumes only 0.6 Watts per hour and can be connected to solar panels for automatic refilling.

#### 51. CHHATTISGARH APPROVES COUNTRY'S THIRD LARGEST TIGER RESERVE

- ➤ The Guru Ghasidas-Tamor Pingla Tiger Reserve, which integrates an existing national park with a wildlife sanctuary, is Chhattisgarh's fourth reserve for the big cats.
- It spans 2,829 square kilometres across four northern districts of the state.
- Manendragarh-ChirmiriBharatpur, Koriya, Surajpur and Balrampur
- Guru Ghasidas National Park was made a tiger reserve in 2021, but it could not be notified due to opposition.
- ➤ Andhra Pradesh's Nagarjunasagar Srisailam Tiger Reserve is the country's largest tiger reserve, covering 3,296.31 sq km.
- Manas Tiger Reserve in Assam is the second largest with an area of 2,837.1 sq km. Both have 58 tigers.



#### 55. UNICEF AND BENGAL PARTNER TO ENGAGE FATHERS IN BREASTFEEDING

- > The West Bengal government and UNICEF have teamed up to encourage fathers to play an active role in promoting breastfeeding among new mothers.
- This initiative aims to enhance family support for breastfeeding and improve the rates of exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months of a child's life.(breast milk as the baby's "first vaccine,")

#### UNICEF

- Created in 1946 as International Children's Emergency Fund (ICEF) by UN relief Rehabilitation Administration to help children affected by World War II
- UNICEF became a permanent part of the United Nations in 1953.
- The name was shortened to United Nations Children Fund but it is still referred to as UNICEF
- Awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1965 for "promotion of brotherhood among the nations"
- Headquarters: New York City.
- Current UNICEF ambassador Kareena Kapoor Khan

#### 56. HINDENBURG RESEARCH ALLEGES SEBI CHIEF

- > The U.S.-based short seller alleged that the chairperson of India's stock market regulator, in charge of probing these issues, herself had a stake in obscure offshore entities used in what it alleged was 'the Adani money siphoning scandal'.
- Almost 18 months after Hindenburg Research flagged allegations of malfeasance and stock price manipulation at the Adani group of companies.

#### SEBI

- The SEBI is a statutory regulatory body established by the Government of India in 1992.
- It was given statutory powers through the SEBI Act, 1992.
- Objective: To regulate the securities market in India and protect the interests of investors in securities.
- Chairperson Mrs. Madhabi Puri Buch

#### 57. IITGN, IIT INDORE JOIN HANDS TO SET UP CNARMADA TO ASSESS RIVER ECOSYSTEM

- Indian Institute of Technology Gandhinagar (IITGN) has set up the Centre for Narmada River Basin Management (cNARMADA) at its campus to conduct the Condition Assessment and Management Plan (CAMP) of the Narmada river basin.
- > IITGN has joined hands with Indian Institute of Technology Indore (IITI) for the assessment undertaken by the Ministry of Jal Shakti.
- It will also prepare a road map for comprehensive rejuvenation and conservation of the riverine ecosystems

#### 58. ANCIENT MAHARASHTRA ROCK ART DECLARED 'PROTECTED MONUMENT' BY MAHA GOVT.

- ➤ Geoglyphs and petroglyphs in Ratnagiri as 'protected monuments' under the Maharashtra Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act, 1960.
- The group of petroglyphs at Deud, Ratnagiri, dates back to the Mesolithic era (roughly 20,000-10,000 years ago).
- ➤ Geoglyphs and petroglyphs are different types of ancient art forms. They involve the creation of images or designs on the earth's surface or rock surfaces



#### 59. UNION GOVERNMENT TO INCLUDE AYUSH IN AYUSHMAN BHARAT SCHEME

- ➤ The Union Government is working on the inclusion of an AYUSH (Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy) package under the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY), Launched in 2018.
- ➤ AB PM-JAY aims to provide health cover of ₹5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation to approximately 55 crore beneficiaries corresponding to 12.34 crore families constituting the bottom 40% of the population.

#### 60. GUIDELINES ISSUED FOR 'MODEL SOLAR VILLAGE' UNDER PM-SURYA GHAR

- The Government has issued operational guidelines for the implementation of Model Solar Village under PM-Surya Ghar-Muft Bijli Yojana.
- Under the scheme emphasis has been placed on creating one Model Solar Village per district across the country



- ➤ A total financial outlay of 800 crore rupees has been allocated for this component, providing 1 crore rupees per selected Model Solar Village.
- ➤ Under this scheme, a village must be a revenue village with a population size above 5,000 or 2,000 for special category states.

#### 61. UNION JAL SHAKTI MINISTRY LAUNCHES FLOOD WATCH INDIA 2.0 APP

- In order to improve flood forecasting and flood management systems in the country, the government of India has launched an improved Flood Watch India 2.0 App. The Flood Watch India app 2.0 provides real-time information on flood situations to users across the country through a smartphone.
- The Flood Watch India 2.0 app has been developed by the **Central Water Commission**, which comes under the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti.

## 62. TRAI MANDATES ALL SERVICE PROVIDERS TO IMMEDIATELY STOP PROMOTIONAL CALLS FROM UNREGISTERED TELEMARKETERS TO CURB INCREASING SPAM CALLS

- ➤ In a major step to curb the increasing number of spam calls, regulator **Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI)** has mandated all service providers to stop voice promotional calls, be pre-recorded or computer generated or otherwise, from all unregistered senders or telemarketers.
- > If any unregistered sender/unregistered telemarketer is found to be misusing its telecom resources, all the telecom resources of such sender shall be disconnected by the the access provider for a period up to two years

#### 63. MINISTRY OF COAL LAUNCHES GLOBAL MINING INITIATIVE TO BOOST COAL PRODUCTION

- > The primary goal of engaging Mining Developers cum Operators (MDOs) is to significantly increase coal production by streamlining operations, enhancing productivity, and reducing mining costs.
- MDOs handle coal mining; from excavation to delivery to Coal India Limited (CIL). They also manage land, environment, and resettlement issues.

#### 64. VULTURE WITH 'DHAKA COLLAR' FOUND IN JHARKHAND

- > A sick vulture of an endangered species, with 'Dhaka' inscribed on a metallic ring on one of its legs, was found in a dam in Jharkhand's Hazaribagh district.
- > The white-backed vulture is a Schedule 1 endangered species.
- An inscription 'gpobox-2624, Dhaka, b67' and a tracking device were also found on the vulture, along with a note: "If found, please contact john.malot@rspb.org.uk."

## 65. HINDU MAN FROM BANGLADESH BECOMES FIRST PERSON TO GET CITIZENSHIP UNDER CAA

➤ A Hindu man from Bangladesh (Dulon Das), living in Assam since June 5, 1988, has become the first person in the northeast to get citizenship under the Citizenship (Amendment) Act of 2019.

#### **Citizenship Amendment Act 2019**

- The citizenship laws in India derived their origins from the constitution under Articles 5-11 and the Citizenship Act of 1955. This Act provided provisions for citizenship by birth, descent, registration and naturalisation.
- It amended the Citizenship Act of 1955 to make illegal migrants who are Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains, Parsis and Christians from Afghanistan, Bangladesh and Pakistan, eligible for Indian citizenship.
- Those from these communities who entered India on or before December 31, 2014, would not be treated as illegal immigrants, providing a path to naturalisation.
- The amendment relaxed the residency requirement from 11 years to 6 years for these communities to acquire Indian citizenship by naturalization
- The amendments for illegal migrants will not apply to certain tribal (under Sixth Schedule) areas in Assam, Meghalaya, Mizoram, and Tripura, as well as states regulated by the "Inner Line" permit (Ar,Mi,Na,Ma,La) under the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulations 1873.

#### 66. NORTH INDIA'S LARGEST FLOATING SOLAR PROJECT COMMISSIONED IN OMKARESHWAR

- > Madhya Pradesh has commissioned the largest floating solar project in central and north India, generating 90 MW at Omkareshwar.
- > Omkareshwar Floating Solar Project is located at Omkareshwar in District Khandwa, Madhya Pradesh.
- > The floating power plant was developed on the backwaters of Omkareshwar dam (it is a gravity dam on the Narmada River).
- It is the biggest solar park in India and the largest floating solar project in central and north India, generating 90 MW of energy
- > This project was developed under the **Union Ministry of Renewable Energy.**
- The project is executed by SJVN Green Energy Limited (SGEL), a wholly owned subsidiary of SJVN, a joint venture between the Government of India and the Government of Himachal Pradesh.
- Project Cost: 646 crores

#### 67. KISAN KI BAAT: GOVERNMENT RADIO PROGRAM TO BRIDGE FARM-SCIENCE GAP

The government is set to launch 'Kisan Ki Baat', a monthly radio programme aimed at bringing scientific knowledge to farmers, Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan announced.



- This initiative seeks to modernise agricultural practices and empower farmers with cutting-edge scientific information.
- Kisan Ki Baat' is part of a larger strategy to revitalize India's agricultural sector. Chouhan stressed the importance of integrating Krishi Vigyan Kendras with farmers' needs and promoting discussions among agriculturists.

## 68. MUSICIAN RICKEY KEJ CREATES GUINNESS WORLD RECORD FOR INDIA'S NATIONAL ANTHEM

➤ The achievement follows Kej's previous success in 2023, where he led the largestever Symphony Orchestra performance of the Indian National Anthem at Abbey Road Studios, London.

## 69. BHARAT JODO ABHIYAAN LAUNCHES JANA GANA MANA ABHIYAAN CAMPAIGN

- Bharat Jodo Abhiyaan (BJA), a civil society platform, has launched an 8-month campaign Jana Gana Mana Abhiyaan (JaGaMA) from August 15 (Independence Day) to April 14, 2025 (Ambedkar Jayanti)
- Objective to promote constitutional values, protect democratic institutions and strengthen non-violent political, ideological and cultural resistance to defend the Republic





#### 70. KIA BENGALURU BECOMES FIRST AIRPORT IN ASIA TO RECEIVE LEVEL 5 ACCREDITATION OF ACI

- ➤ Kempegowda International Airport (KIA) in Bengaluru has become the first in Asia to receive Airports Council International's (ACI) highest Level 5 accreditation.
- ➤ KIA has made a 95.6% reduction in Scope 1 and 2 Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions, attaining the highest emission elimination by an Indian airport, achieved seven years ahead of the initial target of 2030.
- > THE AIRPORT AIMS TO ATTAIN NET ZERO GHG EMISSIONS BY 2050, ENCOMPASSING SCOPE 3 EMISSIONS.

#### 71. CENTRE UNVEILS KRISHI-DSS, A SATELLITE-BASED PLATFORM TO SUPPORT FARMERS

- Krishi-Decision Support System (K-DSS) portal, a satellite-based geospatial platform that will provide farmers with information on the weather, groundwater levels, soil health, reservoir storage levels etc and include data like satellite images.
- > It will utilize satellite imagery to deliver early warnings about potential disasters such as pest attacks and extreme weather events
- > The Krishi-DSS is part of the Digital Public Infrastructure for Agriculture announced by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in her Budget speech
- > Space technologies have been applied in the farm sector since 1969, stressing the need to extend their use beyond paddy and wheat.
- The Krishi-DSS platform has been developed using RISAT1A and VEDAS of the Department of Space.
- > RISAT-1A: Radar Satellite-1
- Visualization of Earth observation Data and Archival System (VEDAS)

## 72. BENGALURU RESEARCHERS DISCOVER THREE NEW EDIBLE BUG SPECIES FROM ARUNACHAL PRADESH

- ➢ Belonging to the genus Coridius of family Dinidoridae (Hemiptera), these stink bugs have been named Coridius adii, Coridius insperatus and Coridius esculentus.
- Coridius adii is named in honour of the Adi tribe, one of the major groups inhabiting mainly the Siang valley in Arunchal Pradesh, which consumes this species as food.



#### 73. CCPA IMPOSES RS 3 LAKH FINE ON SRIRAM'S IAS FOR MISLEADING CLAIMS OVER UPSC 2022 EXAM RESULT

- ➤ The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has imposed a penalty of Rs 3 lakh on Sriram's IAS for advertising misleading claims regarding the result of UPSC Civil Service Exam 2022 : the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution
- > Instead of the 200 selections as claimed by the institute, there were only 171 selected candidates.

#### **Central Consumer Protection Authority**

- As provided in the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has been established w.e.f. 24th July, 2020.
- Objective: to promote, protect and enforce the rights of consumers as a class.
- <u>Composition</u>: It will have a Chief Commissioner as head, and only two other commissioners as members one of whom will deal with matters relating to goods while the other will look into cases relating to services
- Nodal Ministry: Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution.

#### 74. KIREN RIJIJU LAUNCHES PORTAL FOR JIYO PARSI SCHEME

> The portal will enable Parsi couples to apply online under the scheme.



- > Jiyo Parsi Scheme, launched in 2013-14, is a Central Sector Scheme to arrest the population decline of the Parsi community in India.
- The scheme has three components, Medical Assistance, Advocacy & Health of Community:
  - a) Under Medical Component: financial assistance is provided to Parsi Couples for medical treatment
  - b) Under Health of Community Component: financial assistance is provided to Parsi Couples for child care and assistance of elderly people.
  - c) Under Advocacy Component: advocacy/outreach programmes are conducted to generate awareness among the Parsi Population.

#### 75. UNION GOVERNMENT TO FORM COMMITTEE FOR ENSURING SAFETY OF HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

- > The government made the decision after considering the concerns expressed by various healthcare stakeholders, including FORDA (Federation of Resident Doctors Association) and IMA (Indian Medical Association).
- > The central government directed government hospitals to register an FIR within six hours against any verbal abuse or physical violence meted out to healthcare staff.
- ➤ The head of institution shall be responsible for filing an FIR within the stipulated time period.

- > 3 of these tigers will be released into the Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary in Sambalpur
- 2 will be introduced into the Similipal Tiger Reserve in Mayurbhanj.

#### Simlipal Tiger Reserve (STR)

- STR is located within the Mayurbhanj District, in the northernmost part of Odisha.
- It was declared a 'Tiger Reserve' in the year 1956 and included under the national conservation programme 'Project Tiger' in 1973.
- The STR was included as a part of the World Network of Biosphere Reserves by UNESCO in the year 2009.
- It is the only landscape in the world that is home to melanistic tigers.
- Sal is the dominant tree species here.

#### **Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary**

- The Debrigarh wildlife sanctuary is located in the Bargarh district in Odisha.
- It is situated near the city of Sambalpur's Hirakud Dam.
- It was declared a wildlife sanctuary in 1985.

#### 80. 3 ONLINE PLATFORMS LAUNCHED TO BOOST COUNTY'S POWER SECTOR EFFICIENCY

- > The Union Ministry of Power has launched three new online platforms, PROMPT, DRIPS and JAL VIDYUT DPR, to boost the country's power sector's efficiency, transparency and effectiveness.
- > The Union Minister for Power, Manohar Lal Khattar, launched these three new online platforms in New Delhi
- > All these online portals have been developed by the Central Electricity Authority under the Union Ministry of Power.

#### **PROMPT Portal**

- The PROMPT (Portal for Online Monitoring of Projects—Thermal) will facilitate real-time analysis and tracking of thermal power projects under construction in India online.
- This is expected to quickly identify and resolve the issue that leads to delays in the construction of thermal power plants.

#### **JAL VIDYUT DPR Platform**

- The JAL VIDYUT DPR (Monitoring Survey and Investigation Activities of Hydroelectric Projects and Pumped Storage Projects) will provide the real-time status of hydroelectric pumped storage projects under construction in various parts of the country.
- This will ensure better management and coordination for the construction of the pumped hydroelectric plants.

#### Disaster Resource Inventory for Power Sector (DRIPS) portal

- The Disaster Resource Inventory for Power Sector (DRIPS) online portal has been built to quickly identify power disruptions in the country due to natural disasters like cyclones, earthquakes, flooding etc.
- It will link the designated nodal officers of all the departments of the power sector and other agencies in the affected districts and states so that necessary steps are taken to quickly restore power in the affected areas

#### 81. INDIA'S FIRST CONSTITUTION MUSEUM MARKS 75 YEARS OF THE INDIAN CONSTITUTION

India's first Constitution Museum, named "The Constitution Academy and the Rights & Freedoms Museum," is set to be inaugurated by OP Jindal Global University.



> This initiative celebrates the **75th anniversary** of the adoption of the Indian Constitution.

#### 82. CABINET SECRETARY TO HEAD NTF ON MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS SAFETY

- The Ministry of Health and Family Affairs, Government of India, has issued an office order on the constitution of the 14-member National Task Force formed by the Supreme Court for the safety of medical professionals.
- > The office order issued by the ministry appoints Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba as the Chairperson of the National Task Force.
- A postgraduate trainee doctor was allegedly raped and murdered while on duty at RG Kar Medical College in Kolkata. Following widespread protests by doctors nationwide, the Supreme Court suo motto started hearing the case
- > The three-member bench headed by the Chief Justice of India, Justice DY Chandrachud, ordered the setting up of the National Task Force to suggest measures for the safety of the medical professionals in the country.

#### 83. INDIA'S SECOND 700 MW NUCLEAR POWER KAPS-4 PLANT STARTS OPERATIONS AT FULL CAPACITY

- > India's second home-built 700 MW nuclear power reactor at Kakrapar Atomic Power Station (KAPS) in Gujarat started operating at its full capacity,
- The full power operation of KAPS-4 after the smooth operation of its twin unit KAPS-3 at full power demonstrates the strength of the first of a kind indigenous 700 MW Pressurised Heavy Water Reactor (PHWR) design,

#### 84. RBI LAUNCHES NATIONWIDE RBI90QUIZ FOR UNDERGRADUATES

- > The quiz is a nationwide competition being held as part of the events to commemorate 90 years of RBI's functioning.
- > The contest would help create greater awareness about the Reserve Bank and the financial eco system among the students.

#### **RBI(RESERVE BANK OF INDIA)**

- The RBI was established in 1934, under the Reserve Bank of India Act.

#### 85. INDIA APPROVES ADDITIONAL 251 MW POWER EXPORTS FROM NEPAL

- India approved an additional 251 MW of power exports from 12 hydropower projects in Nepal.
- ➤ Nepal will export power to Bihar under a medium-term power sales agreement for the first time.
- ➤ Total approved power export from Nepal to India increased from 690 MW (16 projects) to 941 MW (28 projects).
- ➤ Nepal became a net exporter of electricity, generating NPR 16.93 billion in revenue in the last fiscal year.

#### 86. CENTRE SAYS MEGHALAYA POLIO CASE IS VACCINE-DERIVED

- > A case of vaccine-derived polio has been confirmed in a two-year-old child from Tikrikilla in Meghalaya.
- > This is not a case of wild polio, but an infection that presents in some people with low immunity.
- > The World Health Organisation declared India polio-free in 2014 after the last case of wild poliovirus in the country was reported in 2011.
- Polio (poliomyelitis) is a highly infectious viral disease that enters the body through the mouth, multiplying in the intestine before invading the nervous system.
- It mainly affects children under 5 years of age.

#### **Global Polio Eradication Initiative:**

✓ It was launched in 1988 by national governments and spearheaded by the WHO, Rotary International, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF).

#### **World Polio Day:**

- ✓ It is observed every year on 24th October in order to call on countries to stay vigilant in their fight against the disease Pulse Polio Immunization Programme
- ✓ With the global initiative of eradication of polio in 1988 following the World Health Assembly resolution in 1988,
- ✓ Pulse Polio Immunization programme was launched in India in the financial year 1994-95.

#### 87. KARNATAKA LEADS NATION WITH 5,765 PUBLIC EV CHARGING STATIONS

- With 5,765 charging stations, Karnataka has the highest number of public electric vehicle (EV) charging stations in the country, according to the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE).
- > Around 85% of these stations (4,462) are in Bengaluru Urban district.
- The data from BEE shows that Karnataka stands ahead of Maharashtra (3,728 stations), Uttara Pradesh (1,989 stations), and Delhi (1,941 stations) in the list.
- Karnataka was the first State in India to introduce an EV policy in 2017.



#### 88. ASHWINI VAISHNAW LAUNCHES 'CREATE IN INDIA CHALLENGE-SEASON ONE'

- Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw launched 'Create in India Challenge-Season One' in New Delhi in the run-up to the World Audio Visual and Entertainment Summit.
- > Reflecting the evolution of Indian economy and the impact of technological advancements, **25 challenges** have been launched.

#### 89. SOUTH INDIAN ADIVASI KNOWLEDGE CENTRE TO BE LAUNCHED IN B.R. HILLS

- Kaanu, a South Indian Adivasi Knowledge Centre, will be launched at the Tribal Health Resource Centre (THRC) at BR Hills, Karnataka.
- Kaanu, which means evergreen forest in both Kannada and Soliga language.
- Aims to be the first ever knowledge centre on South Indian Adivasi past, present and culture: a tree of knowledge."

#### 90. LAUNCH OF "BHARAT ZERO EMISSION TRUCKING (ZET) POLICY ADVISORY" DOCUMENT

- > The "Bharat Zero Emission Trucking (ZET) Policy Advisory" aims to guide India towards adopting zero-emission trucks powered by electricity and hydrogen

- > A unicorn is a privately held company valued at or above \$1 billion. There are about 109 unicorns in India.

#### 100. PM MODI DISTRIBUTES CERTIFICATES TO 11 LAKH NEW 'LAKHPATI DIDIS'

#### 102. FSSAI ORDERS REMOVAL OF A1 AND A2 CLAIMS FROM ALL PACKAGING OF MILK AND DAIRY PRODUCTS

- > The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) asked food business operators (FBOs) and e-commerce players to remove all claims of A1 and A2 types of milk and milk products from all packaging.
- FSSAI stated that the A1 and A2 differentiation of milk is essentially linked to a difference in the structure of protein (beta casein).
- The key difference lies in the amino acid structure. A1 beta-casein has a histidine amino acid at position 67, while A2 beta-casein has proline at the same position
- > A2 beta-casein is believed to be easier to digest
- > But as per FSSAI the current rules do not recognise any such differentiation of milk on the basis of A1 and A2 types.

#### 103. UNION HEALTH MINISTER J.P. NADDA LAUNCHES NATIONAL MEDICAL REGISTER PORTAL IN NEW DELHI

- ➤ The National Medical Register (NMR) is mandated under Section 31 of the NMC Act, 2019 which states that the Ethics & Medical Registration Board (EMRB) of NMC shall maintain a National Register in electronic form containing the name, address, and all recognized qualifications possessed by a licensed medical practitioner.
- > NMR will be a comprehensive and dynamic database for all allopathic (MBBS) registered doctors in India.
- NMR will be a part of the Healthcare Professional Registry under the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission

#### 104. CHIRAG PASWAN RE-ELECTED AS PRESIDENT OF LIP FOR 5 YEARS

Union Minister Chirag Paswan was re-elected as the national president of Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) for the next five years.

#### 105. INDIAN GOVERNMENT FLAGSHIP PROGRAMME PMJDY COMPLETES 10 YEARS

- ➤ Wheat Yield Decline: The study showed that when farmers used nano DAP instead of regular DAP, the wheat grain yield decreased by 16.1%.
- Plant Growth Affected: The study also found that plants didn't grow as tall when nano DAP was used



#### 1. POLICE LAUNCH 'NIGRAANI', ENGAGE CHOWKIDAARS TO COMBAT DRUG THREAT OR MENACE

- ➤ The Bathinda police have started an initiative of 'Nigraani' (keeping a watch) by reconnecting village chowkidars (watchmen) with local police stations.
- ➤ As part of police's community engagement, 'Mission Nigraani' has been started on a pilot project basis in around 70 villages which are affected by drug-related issues,



#### 2. UP ASSEMBLY PASSES AMENDED ANTI-CONVERSION BILL

- The Uttar Pradesh Assembly on July 30 passed the UP Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion (Amendment) Bill, 2024 that enhances punishment for forced conversions.
- > The punishment for marrying a woman by deceiving her or converting her religion was 10 years with a fine of ₹50,000. The new Bill now enhances punishment to life imprisonment.

#### What is UP Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion (Amendment) Bill, 2024?

- Parliamentary Affairs Minister Suresh Khanna introduced the Uttar Pradesh Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion (Amendment) Bill, 2024, in the House on July 29.
- The proposed amendment states that if an **individual threatens** attacks, marries, promises to marry, conspires, or traffics a woman, minor, or anyone with the intent to convert them, the offense will be classified as among the most serious.
- If any person is found guilty of this offence, there is a provision of 20 years imprisonment or life imprisonment.

#### 3. KARNATAKA AND TAMIL NADU GOVERNMENT BEGINS TALK ON "MEKEDATU PROJECT"

#### WHAT IS MEKEDATU PROJECT?

- The Mekedatu dam is a multi-purpose (drinking water and power) project proposed by karnataka involving the construction of a balancing reservoir near Kanakapura in the Ramanagara district. Once completed, it is expected to supply over 4 TMC (thousand million cubic feet) of water to Bengaluru city for drinking purposes
- Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, government was ready to discuss with Tamil Nadu regarding the implementation of the Mekedatu project across river Cauvery, but the neighbouring state was not coming forward despite it not "causing any problem to them".

#### 4. TELANGANA ASSEMBLY PASSES BILL TO ESTABLISH YOUNG INDIA SKILLS UNIVERSITY

- > The Telangana state assembly has passed the "Young India Skills University Telangana (Public-Private Partnership) Bill 2024.
- > The bill is aimed at establishing A Skills University to impart skills in 17 subjects, which can ensure the student's employment in the competition of the course at the university.
- > The SC, ST, and BC students will be provided fee reimbursement and a reservation policy will be implemented. The Government had released ₹100 crore for the purpose.

#### 5. WHAT IS THE KARNATAKA MUDA SCAM?


- The Mysuru Urban Development Authority (MUDA), originally called the City Improvement Trust Board (CITB) when it was created in 1904, is responsible for urban planning and development in Mysuru.
- Media reports alleged gross irregularities in the allotment of residential sites by MUDA to land losers as compensation, including Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's wife, Parvathi.
- MUDA started a 50:50 ratio scheme in 2020. This plan gives 50% of the developed land to the original landowners and allows MUDA to keep the other half.

- > Telangana Government has resolved to sanction Group-I posts of **Deputy**

## 7. JHARKHAND LAUNCHES MUKHYAMANTRI MAIYAAN SAMMAN YOJANA FOR WOMEN







- The Mukhyamantri Maiyaan Samman Yojana aims to empower the women of the state by making them financially strong.
- It also aims to improve the level of education, health and nutrition of women by providing them with financial assistance.
- > Women to get Rs 1000 per month, Women in the age group of 21-50 years are eligible for the scheme

#### 8. NEW DELHI HOST 14TH INDO-VIETNAMESE DEFENCE POLICY DIALOGUE

- India hosted the 14th India-Vietnam Defence Policy Dialogue in New Delhi.
- > The meeting was part of the wider military-to-military dialogue between the two countries to strengthen the bilateral defence relationship.

#### 10. HARYANA GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES BRINGING ALL CROPS UNDER MSP

#### What is the Minimum Support Price (MSP)?

- In 1966-67, the government introduced the Minimum Support Price with the objective to:
- Encourage farmers to adopt modern scientific farming to increase production,
- To raise productivity and crop production in the country to meet the emerging demand patterns in the country.
   Commission for Agricultural Costs & Prices (CACP)
- CACP was set up in1965 as an expert committee under the Union Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.
- It calculates the MSP of mandated crops and recommends them to the government.
- The government is not bound to accept the CACP's recommendations, which are advisory in nature.

#### **Mandated Crops under MSP**

- The CACP recommends MSPs for 22 mandated crops and fair and remunerative price (FRP) for sugarcane.
- The mandated crops include 14 crops of the kharif season, 6 Rabi crops and 2 other commercial crops.

#### 11. MAHARASHTRA APPROVES PRISONS AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES BILL

- > The Maharashtra State government drafted and tabled the Maharashtra Prisons and Correctional Services Bill, 2024.
- As 'Prisons' fall under the State List of the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution, it is within the exclusive domain of State governments to legislate on and regulate prisons in their jurisdiction
- Maharashtra has over 60 prisons including nine central, 28 districts, and 19 open prisons.

#### 12. ANDHRA SCRAPS 2-CHILD POLICY FOR INDIVIDUALS TO CONTEST LOCAL BODY POLL

- The **Andhra Pradesh government** has decided to scrap the **two-child norm** for contesting local body elections in view of the declining fertility rate in the state
- 13. TELANGANA TOPS COUNTRY IN ORGAN DONATIONS FROM CADAVER DONORS, MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE

## 14. HARYANA CABINET BRINGS ORDINANCE FOR BACKWARD CLASSES (B) RESERVATIONS IN PANCHAYATI RAJ INSTITUTIONS

- > The amendment provides proportionate reservation for Backward Classes 'B' in Panchayati Raj Institutions.
- > It is based on recommendations from the Haryana Backward Classes Commission.
- > The ordinance reserves seats for BC (B) in positions like Panch, Sarpanch, Panchayat Samiti Members, and Zila Parishad Members.

#### 15. PUNJAB FIRST SCHOOL OF HAPPINESS

- > The Government Primary School at Lakher village in Anandpur Sahib will soon move to a new state-of-the-art building, designed exclusively by architects from Punjab Works Department, to lend happiness to students, with concept of 'bag-free-Saturdays
- > This innovative project aims to create a nurturing and joyful learning environment across the state by upgrading infrastructure, enhancing facilities, and integrating a holistic approach to education

#### 16. WILL CANCEL HIGHWAY PROJECTS: GADKARI TO MANN ON ATTACK ON NHAI ENGINEERS

- ➤ Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari has written to Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann, expressing serious concerns over recent attacks on engineers and contractors associated with the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) in Jalandhar and Ludhiana.
- ➤ Gadkari urged the Punjab government to take immediate corrective measures, including the registration of FIRs and strict action against those responsible for the attacks.
- If the situation does not improve, NHAI will have no other option but to cancel/terminate 8 other severely affected projects with a total length of 293 km costing ₹14,288 crore

#### 17. PUNJAB HELP CENTRE LAUNCHED AT IGI AIRPORT TO ASSIST NRIS

- Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann inaugurated the 'Punjab Help Centre' at IGI Airport, New Delhi, marking the first state-run NRI Facilitation Centre in India.
- The 24x7 centre offers assistance with flights, taxi services, lost luggage, and emergency accommodations.







#### 18. MAHARASHTRA GOVERNMENT APPROVES LOGISTICS POLICY 2024

- The Maharashtra government has approved the Logistics Policy 2024, aimed at revolutionizing the state's logistics infrastructure and generating approximately 500,000 job opportunities.
- The policy includes the development of over **200 logistics parks, complexes, and truck terminals** equipped with advanced facilities.

#### 19. WHAT IS THE UPASTHITI PORTAL?

- > Chief Minister Hemant Soren launched the 'Upasthiti Portal' to track daily attendance of health workers in Jharkhand.
- This system will verify biometric attendance to ensure accountability.

#### 20. CM YOGI ADITYANATH INAUGURATES THE 'KAKORI TRAIN ACTION' CENTENARY FESTIVAL

- The Kakori Train Action was a train robbery, committed by the revolutionaries of the Indian independence movement against the British Raj on August 9, 1925, in a village called Kakori near Lucknow.
- > This robbery was carried out by 10 revolutionaries including Hindustan Republican Association's revolutionary Ram Prasad Bismil, Ashfaqullah Khan, Rajendra Lahiri, Keshav Chakraborty, Mukundi Lal, and Banwari Lal.
- > Significantly, freedom fighters Ram Prasad Bismil, Ashfaqullah Khan and Roshan Singh were hanged on December 19, 1927 for their involvement in the Kakori Conspiracy.
- The forest department will establish Shaheed Smriti Vatika in every district as a tribute to the martyrs of Kakori. Preparations are also underway for a Shaheed Smriti Yatra by 100 cyclists to mark the occasion
- > A Kakori Literature Festival will be held, showcasing an exhibition of books related to Kakori freedom fighters, the freedom movement, and the Kakori train action.
- It is renamed because the word 'Kand' refers to the sense of humiliation of the incident during India's freedom struggle.

#### 21. THE 'HAATIAPP', DEVELOPED IN ASSAM

- An Assam-based biodiversity organisation has developed a mobile phone application for all stakeholders toward mitigating human-elephant conflict and coexisting with the large animals in the State and elsewhere in the northeast.
- > The 'HaatiApp', envisaged as an early warning system about the presence of wild elephants in the proximity of human settlements, is scheduled to be launched along with a solar fence manual.


#### Main features of the Cash for Sanitary Napkins scheme

#### Udita Scheme of the Madhya Pradesh Government

- The state government launched the Udita Scheme on 1 November 2016 under its Women and Child Development Project to address the myths and taboos related to menstruation.
- The Scheme is being implemented through Anganwadi workers and assistants.
- The first phase of the scheme was implemented in Gwalior, Indore and Badwani and later in all the districts of Madhya Pradesh.
- Adolescents and women in the age group of 18 to 49 years are eligible under the Udita scheme.

- > This initiative is part of a broader effort by the Haryana government to improve the living conditions of its poorest citizens
- 26. HIMACHAL PRADESH GOVERNMENT LAUNCHES "HIM UNNATI YOJNA" TO PROMOTE NATURAL FARMING Aimed at boosting production of milk, vegetables, fruits, and other cash crops through structured incentives.

#### 27. MAHARASHTRA LAUNCHES ₹1,500 MONTHLY AID UNDER 'LADKI BAHIN' SCHEME

- > Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis announced that over one crore eligible women in the State
- > will start receiving ₹1,500 per month under the government's 'Mukhyamantri Ladki Bahin' scheme, which is set to launch on August 17.
- > The flagship scheme modelled after the 'Ladli Behna Yojana' introduced by the previous Shivraj Singh Chouhan-led government in Madhya Pradesh
- ➤ Under the Ladki Bahin scheme, underprivileged (annual family income capped at ₹2.5 lakh) women aged 21 to 65 years will get monthly financial assistance from the government.
- > July will be considered the starting month. Consequently, eligible women will receive an initial installment of ₹3,000, covering two months.

#### 28. U.P. CM LAUNCHES MUKHYAMANTRI YUVA UDYAM VIKAS ABHIYAN YOJANA

- Announced on 78th Independence Day
- > to promote entrepreneurship among youth
- > Under the scheme, financial support will be provided to young individuals interested in entrepreneurship.
- With a target of establishing one million micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSME) units across the state.

## 29. ANDHRA PRADESH GOVT. AIMS TO DOUBLE HORTICULTURE CROP ACREAGE UNDER MICRO-IRRIGATION BY 2029


- The Andhra Pradesh government is considering a proposal to provide 90% subsidy to horticulture farmers opting for micro irrigation under Andhra Pradesh Micro Irrigation Project (APMIP).
- > The proposal aims to increase horticultural production by at least 15% every year through a new policy.
- At present, horticulture crops are being grown on around 15 lakh hectares in the State and the government aims to increase the acreage by at least 3 lakh hectares a year for five years, taking the total to around 30 lakh hectares.
- > Andhra Pradesh is the largest producer of fruits in India, contributing 15.6% of the total production.
- Andhra Pradesh ranks first in the productivity of oil palm, papaya, lime, cocoa, tomato and coconut and second in chilli in India

- Students from nursery to class eight will be provided boiled eggs or fruits once a week. The fresh fruits will be sourced from local markets based on the preferences of the children,
- The scheme will complement the existing mid-day meal scheme and provide nutritious food to children in government schools.
- It will cover **15,181 government schools** and 5,34,293 students in the state.
- The state government has allocated Rs.12.75 crore for the 'Mukhyamantri Bal Poshtik Aahar Yojana' for 2024-25

#### 33. MP BECOMES 1ST STATE TO NOTIFY RULES FOR SERVING SUMMONS & WARRANTS ONLINE

- > It permits the use of electronic methods such as email, messaging apps like WhatsApp and text messages in its judicial processes.
- The Madhya Pradesh Home Department has officially published the Madhya Pradesh Electronic Processes (Issuance, Service and Execution) Rules, 2024 in the Madhya Pradesh Gazette.
- this development, sanctioned under the country's new law, the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, aims to accelerate judicial procedures, fortify legal proceedings and enhance the efficiency of the judicial system



## 34. TO PREVENT UNDERAGE MARRIAGES, ASSAM GOVT APPROVES BILL TO ABOLISH MUSLIM MARRIAGES, DIVORCE REGISTRATION ACT & RULES

- > The Assam cabinet approved the Assam Compulsory Registration of Muslim Marriage and Divorce Bill, 2024, mandating Muslims to register marriages and divorces with the government.
- > This will eliminate the role of "qazis" in this process, and aims to curb child marriages.
  - ✓ <u>Objective</u>: The Assam government approved a new bill aimed at abolishing the Assam Muslim Marriages and Divorce Registration Act, 1935.
  - ✓ <u>Main Focus</u>: To prevent underage marriages and streamline the registration of Muslim marriages and divorces under government authority
  - ✓ Child Marriage: The new bill prohibits the registration of child marriages (males under 21 years and females under 18 year
  - ✓ New Process: All Muslim marriages and divorces will now be registered at the subregister's office, instead of by qazis (traditional religious authorities)

#### 35. UTTARAKHAND HAS BECOME THE FIRST INDIAN STATE TO LAUNCH A GROSS ENVIRONMENT PRODUCT INDEX

- > Uttarakhand is the first state in the world where the development of the ecosystem will be assessed through the Gross Environmental Product Index.
- > The Himalayan Environmental Studies and Conservation Organisation is the creator of the Gross Environment Product Index.
- > There are four pillars of the Gross Environment Product Index: air, soil, tree and water.

#### 36. ODISHA CM MAJHI LAUNCHES SUBHADRA SCHEME

- ➤ Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Majhi announced the Subhadra scheme, which will provide ₹50,000 to one crore women aged 21 to 60 over five years, with a total budget of ₹55,825 crore. Payments of ₹10,000 annually will be made in two installments each year.

#### 44. HIMACHAL PRADESH PASSES BILL TO RAISE WOMEN'S MARRIAGE AGE FROM 18 TO 21 YEARS

- ➤ The Himachal Pradesh State Assembly passed the Prohibition of Child Marriage (Himachal Pradesh Amendment) Bill, 2024, increasing the minimum age of marriage for women from 18 to 21 years in order to support gender equality and higher education.
- > The Bill amended the Prohibition of Child Marriage (PCM) Act, which was passed by Parliament in 2006.
- 45. 'UP DIGITAL MEDIA POLICY 2024' : RS 8 LAKH MONTHLY INCOME FOR PROMOTING POLICIES, LIFE IMPRISONMENT FOR ANTI-NATIONAL CONTENT
  - > Under the policy, the government would give advertisements to eligible visual and digital media firms and influencers active on popular social media platforms of X, Facebook, Instagram and YouTube.



- > The maximum payment to account holders, operators and influencers of X, Facebook and Instagram has been fixed at Rs 5 lakh, Rs 4 lakh, Rs 3 lakh per month
- Category-wise ceiling for payment pertaining to videos, shorts and podcasts and other type of content on YouTube has been fixed at Rs 8 lakh, Rs 7 lakh, Rs 6 lakh and Rs 4 lakh per month.

#### 46. UP GOVT TO GIVE SCHOLARSHIP TO ALL STUDENTS OF SANSKRIT SCHOOLS

- > The Uttar Pradesh government decided to give scholarships to all students studying in over 500 Sanskrit schools in the state.
- Earlier, only the children of families with annual income up to Rs 50,000 were given scholarships, but now the income limit has been removed.
- > It was also decided to hike the scholarship amount for those in classes 9 to 12 in these schools.
- > The new scholarship amount ranges between Rs 50 and Rs 200 per month for students.

- 1. INDIA'S ASTROSAT OBSERVATORY DISCOVERS VAMPIRE STAR "M67"
- 2. NASA DISCOVERS COLDEST EXOPLANET "EPSILON INDI-AB", 12 LIGHT YEARS FROM EARTH
  - > The discovery was made using the James Webb Space Telescope's (JWST) Mid-InfraRed Instrument (MIRI).
  - > The planet orbits the K5V-type star Epsilon Indi A, located 12 light-years from Earth.
  - > The exoplanet has a temperature of about -1°C (30°F) and orbits its star at a distance 28 times greater than the Earth-Sun distance.

#### 3. FOOD POISIONING LEADS TO FOUR DEATHS IN LISTERIOSIS OUTBREAK IN USA AND CANADA

- > Listeriosis is a foodborne bacterial illness that can affect anyone exposed to a contaminated food product, including the recalled products.
- While healthy individuals can fall ill from a *Listeria* infection, the disease can be fatal for unborn babies, newborns, individuals over age 60, and those with weakened immune systems.

#### 4. SHUBHANSHU SHUKLA OF IAF SELECTED AS PRIMARY GAGANYATRI FOR ISS MISSION

- ➤ The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has announced the names of the two Indian gaganyatri (astronauts) for the forthcoming joint India -United States of America (USA) mission to the International Space Station (ISS).
- According to the ISRO, the National Mission Assignment Board has selected Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla as the prime gaganyatri and Group Captain Prasanth Balakrishnan Nair as the backup gaganyatri.



> Humans who travel in space are called astronauts. The Chinese call them Taikonauts, Russians call them Cosmonauts and Indians Gaganyatri.

#### **Axiom-4 mission to the ISS**

- NASA is the national space agency of the USA government.
- To operationalise the 2023 agreement, the Human Space Flight Center of the ISRO signed a Space Flight Agreement (SFA) with Axiom Space Inc., USA, for its upcoming Axiom-4 mission to the ISS.
- Axiom Company is a NASA-identified service provider which provides human space flight services to NASA for the space flight to the ISS..
- Only one **Indian** will go to the ISS, and he will conduct various scientific experiments on board the ISS and engage in space outreach activities.

#### ISRO TO LAUNCH REMOTE SENSING EOS 8 SATELLITE ON 55TH FOUNDATION DAY

- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) will launch its Earth Observation Satellite-08 (EOS-08) on 15 August 2024, its 55th foundation day.
- > ISRO was formed on **15 August 1969** as the premier space agency of the government of India.
- > The EOS-08 satellite will be launched by ISRO's Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV)-D3.
- Here, **D** stands for **Developmental**. The satellite will be launched from **Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.**
- ➤ The EOS-08 is a **remote-sensing microsatellite** with a mass of around 175.5 kg. It will be placed in a **Circular Low-Earth Orbit (LEO) at an altitude of 475 km.**
- > The life of the satellite is **around 1 year.**
- > The satellite has the capability to capture images both during the day and night in the Mid-Wave and Long-Wave infrared bands for applications such as satellite-based disaster monitoring, environmental monitoring, fire detection, surveillance, industrial and power plant disaster monitoring and volcanic activity observation,

#### 6. CHINA TO LAUNCH SATELLITE CONSTELLATION TO RIVAL MUSK'S STARLINK

- ➤ China is close to launching its **first batch of satellites** for a mega constellation aimed at rivaling US company **SpaceX's Starlink Internet network**; state-run **Shanghai Spacecom Satellite Technology (SSST)** launched the first components on the network. SSST's constellation has been named **"Thousand Sails."**
- The project, also known as the **G60 Constellation**, was set up last year to establish a Chinese-based global low-Earth orbit (LEO) satellite Internet network competitor to Starlink.
- 7. PINE LAB SETU AND AXIS BANK LAUNCHES "UPISETU"
- 8. HUGE UNDERGROUND RESERVOIR OF LIQUID WATER ON MARS, SEISMIC DATA INDICATES
  - A massive reservoir of liquid water, equal to an ocean, is found hiding under Mars.



- The water deposit found fractured within igneous rocks is so huge that it is enough to fill an ocean that can cover the entire Earth's planetary neighbour, concluded scientists who observed the recent seismic data of Mars.
- The claims were made based on data received from NASA's robotic InSight Lander during a mission to help decipher the interior of Mars.

#### 9. ICMR AND PANACEA BIOTEC INITIATE THE FIRST DENGUE VACCINE PHASE 3 CLINICAL TRIAL

The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and Panacea Biotec announced the commencement of the Phase 3 clinical trial of India's first indigenous dengue vaccine, DengiAll.

- ➤ India's first indigenous dengue vaccine marks a critical advancement in our fight against dengue.
- According to WHO report approximately 75-80% of infections in India are asymptomatic, yet these individuals can transmit the infection through the bite of Aedes mosquitoes.



## 10. SWEDEN REPORTS MPOX CLADE I; WHO CALLS FOR GLOBAL ACTION

- > Sweden has confirmed its first case of the mpox Clade I variant, marking the first occurrence of this more dangerous strain outside Africa.
- > The World Health Organization (WHO) has called for enhanced surveillance, data sharing, and international cooperation to manage and control the outbreak.

#### 11. NPCI SPINS OFF BHIM INTO A SEPARATE ARM; LALITHA NATARAJ APPOINTED CEO

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) incorporated Bharat Interface for Money (BHIM) as a whollyowned subsidiary, into a new entity known as NPCI-BHIM Services Ltd (NBSL).

#### 12. NASA "NEOWISE TELESCOPE" MISSION ENDED

- Nasa's Near-Earth Object Wide-field Infrared Survey Explorer (NEOWISE) has concluded its mission, marking the end of a journey spanned over a decade
- ➤ Launched in 2009, WISE originally aimed to explore the universe's farthest reaches, observing distant galaxies, supermassive blackholes.

#### 13. SPACEX'S POLARIS DAWN MISSION: THE FIRST PRIVATE SPACEWALK

- > SpaceX's upcoming Polaris Dawn mission is set to make history as the first private spacewalk.
- > Five-day expedition will be led by American billionaire Jared Isaacman, who previously chartered the Inspiration4 mission in 2021.
- > The mission will utilize a Falcon 9 rocket and the Crew Dragon capsule, Resilience, for its third flight

#### 14. RARE ASTRONOMICAL OF SUPERMOON BLUEMOON SEEN ON AUGUST 19, 2024

➤ This is an unusual astronomical feat — the full moon being both a "blue moon" and a "super moon," giving rise to the "Super Blue Moon," a rare trifecta of astronomical events.

#### 15. NPCI LAUNCHES 'UPI CIRCLE' FOR SECURE PAYMENTS AMONG TRUSTED USERS

NPCI's new 'UPI Circle' feature allows primary UPI users to delegate payment responsibilities to trusted secondary users, enhancing convenience and security in digital transactions.

#### 16. KERALA ISSUES ALERT AGAINST MPOX

- > The State Health department has issued an alert against mpox (known earlier as Monkeypox) with the World Health Organization last week declaring that the outbreak in many African nations now has to be considered a Public Health Emergency of International Concern.
- Mpox outbreak has been spreading in many Central and Eastern African nations since 2023, The disease, caused by a virus of the same family as small pox

#### Mpox (Monkeypox)

- A viral zoonotic disease caused by the monkeypox virus.
- First Human Case: Recorded in 1970 in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).
- Types (Clades): Two known clades Clade I (Central Africa) and Clade II (West Africa)
- Symptoms: Skin rash, fever, headache, muscle aches, back pain, and swollen lymph nodes.
- Transmission: Through direct contact with body fluids (including sexual contact) or indirect contact with contaminated clothing or bedding.
- Treatment: No specific treatments for monkeypox virus infection.

#### 17. INDIA LAUNCHES WORLD'S FIRST MOBILE-LAUNCHED HYBRID ROCKET, RHUMI-I

- In a boost to India's space effort, the world's first mobile hybrid rocket, RHUMI-1, was successfully launched on 24 August 2024. The successful launch of the RHUMI-1 rocket also marks the launch of the first reusable hybrid rocket in India.
- > The rocket was developed by Chennai-based startup Space Zone India in collaboration with Martin Group.
- > The RHUMI-1 reusable hybrid rocket launched three CubeSats and 50 PICO satellites into a suborbital trajectory.
- > The satellites will collect data for research on Global warming and Climate Change.
- The RHUMI-1 reusable hybrid rocket was launched from a **mobile launcher** in **Thiruvidandhai**, a coastal village in **Chennai**, **Tamil Nadu**.



> RUHMI-1, a sounding rocket, flew at an altitude of about 35 km and returned to Earth after conducting several experiments within seconds.

#### 18. BHARAT BIOTECH UNVEILS ORAL CHOLERA VACCINE AMID GLOBAL SHORTAGE

- ➤ Bharat Biotech International Ltd has launched Hillchol (BBV131), a novel single-strain oral cholera vaccine (OCV) developed under license from Hilleman Laboratories.
- > This launch is critical as global demand for **OCVs exceeds 100 million** doses annually, and there has been a deficit of approximately **40 million doses** due to limited supply.



#### 21. WHAT IS AN OVITRAP?

- ➤ To curb the spread of mosquito-borne diseases like dengue and malaria, the Health Department and the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) have installed ovitraps, a first-of-a-kind initiative in Bengaluru.
- > Ovitraps, which attract and eliminate mosquitoes, have been installed in Gopalpura
- > An ovitrap is a pot-shaped device which is filled with a combination of water and certain chemicals.
- This chemical mixture attracts egg-laying mosquitoes, specifically Aedes mosquitoes, and destroys them once they are trapped.

#### 25. NASA ENGINEERS DESIGN UNDERWATER ROBOTS TO COMBAT CLIMATE CHANGE

- > NASA engineers are developing underwater robot probes to measure the rate of ice shelf melting in Antarctica due to climate change.
- > These robots, **developed by NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory**, aim to provide accurate data to improve predictions of sea level rise.
- ➤ The project involves deploying prototypes in harsh environments like the Arctic.

#### INDIAN NAVY'S INS SHALKI ARRIVES IN COLOMBO FOR TWO-DAY VISIT

- Indian submarine INS Shalki is on a two-day visit to Sri Lanka in reflection of growing maritime security cooperation between the two countries.
- > INS Shalki is Shishumar class diesel-electric submarine, commissioned into the Indian Navy on February 7, 1992.
- > It is the first ever submarine to be built in India.

#### 2. IAF GIVES GREEN SIGNAL TO BDL TO PRODUCE 200 ASTRA MK-1 MISSILE

- The **Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)** developed the **Astra Mk-1**, which is being manufactured by **Bharat Dynamics Limited**, a public-sector company.
- The Astra is an air-to-air beyond visual range (BVR) missile that can be fired from the Indian Air Force's Sukhoi 30MKI, the LCA Tejas fighter aircraft, and the Indian Navy's Mig-29K fighter plane.
- > The Astra Mk-1 has a range of **80-110 km** with a **maximum speed of 4.5 Mach**. One Mach is equal to the speed of the sound.

#### 3. SHIVALIK WINS NAVAL GUNFIRE SUPPORT COMPETITION AT RIMPAC 2024

- ➤ INS Shivalik of the Eastern Fleet has emerged victorious in the **Naval Gunfire Support Competition** at the Rim of the Pacific Exercise- 2024 (RIMPAC-2024), held in Hawaii and **won the coveted RODEO trophy.**
- The event which featured 25 partner nations

#### About Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) Exercise:

- 29th biennial Exercise Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC), a multinational exercise involving 29 nations and more than 25,000 personnel, in and around the Hawaiian Islands.
- It's one of the largest biennial multilateral Naval Exercises, which is led by US.
- The RIMPAC started in 1971 as an annual exercise by the US, Australia, and Canada. But from 1974, maritime exercise became a biennial event.
- India first participated in RIMPAC in 2014 with INS Sahyadri.
- Theme 2024: "Partners: Integrated and Prepared."

#### 4. ITBP TO GET RUSSIAN KAMAZ TYPHOON VEHICLE FOR LAC

- ➤ The Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) has successfully conducted a demonstration and trial of the formidable Typhoon vehicle at its Transport Battalion in Chandigarh
- ➤ Kamaz-53949 Typhoon-K is a Russian-made 4×4 Mine-Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicle.
- > It was developed by Remdiesel, a subsidiary of KamAZ.
- Maximum road speed of 100 km/h and a range of up to 1,000 km without refueling.

#### Indo-Tibetan Border Police Force (ITBPF)

- It is a Central Armed Police Force functioning under the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.
- The ITBP was raised on 24 October 1962 during the Indo-China War.

- Along with Russia, the Indian Air Force is one of the largest operators of Sukhoi Su-30 fighter jets. The Indian variant of the Sukhoi Su-30 fighter jet is called the Su-30MKI (Modernised Commercial for IndiaModernizirovannyy Kommercheskiy Indiyskiy, meaning ".")

#### 7. IIT INDORE DEVELOPS E-SHOES FOR LIVE LOCATION TRACKING

IIT Indore has created advanced shoes incorporating Tribo-Electric Nanogenerator (TENG) technology, which generates electricity from human motion and integrates GPS for real-time location tracking.







These shoes, delivered to the Defence Research and Development Organisation (**DRDO**), aim to enhance the safety and efficiency of armed forces personnel and have applications in various other fields.

#### 8. 10TH BILATERAL MITRA SHAKTI MILITARY EXERCISE COMMENCES IN SRI LANKA

- The annual bilateral Mitra Shakti military exercise between the Indian Army and the Sri Lankan Army commenced in the Sri Lankan Army Training School, Maduru Oya, on 12 August 2024.
- The annual Mitra Shakti exercise started in 2012 and is held alternately in India and Sri Lanka.
- The 2024 exercise is the 10th edition, and the 9th exercise was held in Pune, India, in 2023.

#### 9. INDIAN NAVY TO LAUNCH ITS SECOND NUCLEAR SUBMARINE "INS ARIGHAT"

- > The INS Arighat, India's second indigenously built SSBN, is currently in the final stages of trials and upgrades as required by the Indian Navy.
- According to sources, the submarine is expected to be officially commissioned into service within the next two months. Once commissioned, INS Arighat will join **INS Arihant**, which was inducted into the Navy in 2016, as part of India's growing fleet of nuclear submarines.

#### 10. DRDO SUCCESSFULLY TESTED ITS FIRST LONG-RANGE GLIDE BOMB, GAURAV

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully tested its Long-Range Glide Bomb, **Gaurav**, off the coast of Odisha.
- The smart bomb was dropped from the Indian Air Force's Su-30 MK-I fighter plane. The successful testing of the smart bomb is likely to enhance the Indian Air Force's combat capability.
- > Long-range Glide Bombs are smart bombs that enable the Air Force to hit targets that are beyond the reach of conventional munitions. They are dropped by a fighter plane at a safe distance from the enemy air defence system.

- The National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL) has unveiled a groundbreaking development in defence technology: fully indigenous kamikaze drones.
- ➤ These "do-and-die" unmanned aerial vehicles, equipped with homebuilt engines, are capable of flying up to 1,000 kilometers, marking a significant stride in India's defense capabilities
- Kamikaze drones also known as loitering munitions

## 13. RECENTLY, JAPAN ISSUED ITS FIRST-EVER 'MEGAQUAKE ADVISORY' ON THE NANKAI TROUGH, A SUBDUCTION ZONE

- A 7.1-magnitude earthquake struck southern Japan, prompting the Japan Meteorological Agency to issue it's first-ever "megaquake advisory."
- ➤ The advisory highlighted an increased likelihood of strong shaking and large tsunamis, particularly along the Nankai Trough, a subduction zone along Japan's southwest Pacific coast.

#### What is the Nankai Trough?

- ✓ The Nankai Trough is an underwater subduction zone (nearly 900 km long) where the Eurasian Plate collides with the Philippine Sea Plate, pushing the latter under the former and into the Earth's mantle.
- ✓ This accumulates tectonic stress which can cause a megaquake an earthquake with a magnitude larger than 8.
- ✓ These tremors usually come in pairs, with the second often rupturing in the subsequent two years the most recent "twin" earthquakes took place in 1944 and 1946.

#### 14. NIPUN MUNITION

- > The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has transferred the Authority Holding Sealed Particulars (AHSP) of the 'Nipun' munition to the Directorate General of Quality Assurance (DGQA) at the Armament Research & Development Establishment (ARDE) in Pashan, Pune
- NIPUN is a new anti-personnel mine designed and developed by the Armament Research and Development Establishment (ARDE) in Pune, India, in collaboration with the High Energy Materials Research Laboratory (HEMRL).
- > The mine is intended to be the first line of defense against enemy infantry and infiltrators, and is meant to be used against humans.
- NIPUN is considered to be more effective and potent than existing anti-personnel mines, and is said to be safe to handle, transport, and lay



#### 19. INDIA TO INK REPEAT ORDER FOR 73,000 SIG 716 RIFLES FROM THE US

- > The Indian Defence Ministry is finalizing a repeat order for **73,000 SiG 716 G2 patrol assault rifles from the US** to equip its frontline troops.
- This follows a 2019 procurement of 72,400 SiG 716 rifles (7.62 x 51mm calibre) under the 'Buy (Global)' category through a fast-track procedure, which were distributed across the Army, Air Force, and Navy.

## 20. US APPROVED A \$52.8 MILLION DEAL TO SELL ANTI SUBMARINE WARFARE SONOBUOYS TO INDIA

- Sonobuoys are electro-mechanical acoustic sensors that relay underwater sounds emitted from ships & submarines; they are critical for anti-submarine warfare.
- ➤ A naval helicopter or fixed-wing aircraft generally drops sonobuoys in a pattern. An inflatable system with a radio transmitter remains on the surface for communication with the ship or aircraft tracking it while sensors descend below the surface to predetermined depth.



## 21. FIRST INDIGENOUSLY DEVELOPED POLLUTION CONTROL VESSEL LAUNCHED IN GOA

- > The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) launched its first indigenously developed Pollution Control Vessel, 'Samudra Pratap,' in Goa.
- Emphasized the need for industry partners to contribute towards India becoming fully self-sufficient (Aatmanirbhar) in defense production and a net exporter.
- > The vessel, built by Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL), aims to address oil spillage along India's coastlines and represents a significant milestone in indigenous shipbuilding.

- These caps stand for "freedom, identity and spirit in France
- > The Olympic Phryge and the Paralympic Phryge live by the mantra "Alone we go faster, but together we go further",
- > There are three sports that are being dropped from the Paris Olympics, which were there at the Tokyo Olympics in 2021: baseball, softball and karate.



- ➤ The Indian shooting contingent bagged the third medal for India at the 2024 Paris Olympics Games. Shooter **Swapnil Kusale** of Maharstra won a bronze medal in the men's **50m rifle 3 Positions** final played at the National Shooting Center in Châteauroux, Paris,
- The gold medal was won by the world record holder **Liu Yukun** of China with 463.6 points, while the silver was won by Ukraine's **Serhiy Kulish** with 461.3 points.

3rd Olympic medal in Rifle events for India

- Swapnil Kusale's bronze medal was the 3rd medal for India in the Rifle event in Olympic history.
- Abhinav Bindra won the first medal for India in the rifle shooting event. He won a gold medal in the 10m air rifle at the 2008 Beijing Olympics.
- Gagan Narang won a bronze in the 10m air rifle event at the 2012 London Olympics.







- ✓ The Global North dominates the Global South through political and economic exploitation.
- ✓ American political activist Carl Oglesby is given credit for coining the term 'Global South' in 1969.

#### RUDRAPRAYAG IN UTTARANCHAL WAS RANKED FIRST ON ISRO 'LANDSLIDE ATLAS'

- ➤ National-level database created by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) in 2023 based on exposure to landslides in terms of "key socio-economic parameters."
- In ranking 147 districts in India for their exposure to landslides in terms of key socio economic parameters, 13 of Kerala's districts feature in the top 50.
- > Wayanad ranked 13th, while Thrissur, Palakkad, Malappuram and Kozhikode ranked third, fifth, seventh and tenth respectively
- The ISRO database covered "seasonal, event-based and routewise" landslide inventories for the 1998-2022 periods.

#### 2. INDEX OF EIGHT CORE INDUSTRIES FOR JUNE 2024

- The Index of Eight Core Industries (ICI) recorded a provisional increase of 4.0% in June 2024 compared to June 2023. Positive growth was noted in the production of Coal, Electricity, Natural Gas, Steel, Fertilizers, and Cement.
- > The final growth rate for March 2024 stands at 6.3%, with a cumulative growth rate of 5.7% from April to June 2024.

#### NEARLY A QUARTER OF ADOLESCENT GIRLS SUFFER PARTNER VIOLENCE, WHO STUDY

- Around a quarter of adolescent girls who have been in relationships have endured physical or sexual violence, a World Health Organization study, calling for more prevention actions.
- > The WHO analysis published in the Lancet medical journal was based on surveys from thousands of adolescent girls aged between 15 and 19 from 154 countries and areas.
- It showed that 24% of them had been subjected to intimate partner violence at least once, with 16% reporting it in the past year.
- > The data was based on surveys conducted between 2000 and





#### 1. PROJECT TIGER TO DISPLACE 5.5 LAKH TRIBALS, SAYS RIGHTS GROUP REPORT

- > The displacement per tiger reserve increased exponentially after 2021, from 5,000 per protected area to 48,333, the report released on the International Tiger Day said
- A 967% increase in displacement over the pre-2021 period.
- > The report titled 'India's Tiger Reserves: Tribals Get Out, Tourists Welcome
- ➤ No tigers were found in five tiger reserves Sahyadri (Maharashtra), Satkosia (Odisha), Kamlang (Arunachal Pradesh), Kawal (Telangana), and Dampa (Mizoram) but a total of 5,670 tribal families were displaced from these five tiger reserves

#### 2. HOTTER KALAHARI DESERT MAY STOP HORNBILLS BREEDING BY 2027

- > In the Kalahari, air temperatures have already risen more than 2°C in a few decades.
- > The effects of air temperature and drought on the breeding output of southern yellow-billed hornbills (Tockus leucomelas) in Africa's Kalahari Desert over a decade period, from 2008 to 2019.
- > These birds are still common across much of central and eastern southern Africa.
- > In India: India is home to nine species of hornbills

## 3. GOVERNMENT DECLARES ADICHUNCHANAGIRI IN KARNATAKA AND CHOOLANNUAR IN KERALA AS PEACOCK SANCTUARY

- > Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Mr. Bhupender Yadav said that the Central Government has declared Adichunchanagiri in Karnataka and Choolannuar in Kerala as Peacock Sanctuary.
- Adichunchanagiri Peacock Sanctuary sanctuary is situated in Nagamangala Taluk of Mandya District. It was first notified in 1981 and finally declared in 1999.
- > Choolannur Pea Fowl Sanctuary or Mayiladumpara, as it is locally known, is located in Palakkad district. It was declared as a peacock sanctuary in 1996.

#### 4. NEELAKURINJI BECOMES A 'THREATENED SPECIES,' OFFICIALLY

- The endangered purple bloom of the Western Ghats, Neelakurinji (Strobilanthes kunthiana), was recently added to the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List of Threatened Species.
- > The latest global assessment confirms its threatened status in the Vulnerable (Criteria A2c) category of the IUCN
- > Neelakurinji (Strobilanthes kunthiana), the purplish flowering shrub, which blooms once in 12 years

#### NANJARAYAN, KAZHUVELI & TAWA RESERVOIR NEWLY ADDED RAMSAR SITES

- ➤ Three new sites -Nanjarayan Bird Sanctuary and Kazhuveli Bird Sanctuary in Tamil Nadu and Tawa Reservoir in Madhya Pradesh—have been designated as Wetlands of International Importance or Ramsar Sites, bringing the total number of wetlands declared as Ramsar sites in India to 85.
- ➤ **Bhupender Yadav**, the Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, announced the addition of the three new wetlands to the Ramsar site

#### **India and Ramsar Convention**

- India ratified the Ramsar Convention in 1982.
- The first Indian wetland sites included in the Convention were **Chilika Lake (Odisha) and Keoladeo National Park** (Rajasthan) in 1981.
- Amongst the states, **Tamil Nadu** has 18 sites, followed by Uttar Pradesh, which has 10.
- Largest Ramsar site in India: Sunderban of West Bengal
- Smallest Ramsar site in India: Renuka in Himachal Pradesh
- The list of the Ramsar sites is maintained by the Ramsar convention's secretariat, based at the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) headquarters in Gland, Switzerland.

#### 6. CABINET EXTENDS PM JI-VAN YOJANA IMPLEMENTATION BY 5 YEARS, TO INFUSE FURTHER FUNDS

- > Prime Minister Narendra Modi approved extension of modified Pradhan Mantri JI-VAN (Jaiv Indhan- Vatavaran Anukool fasal awashesh Nivaran) Yojana for another five years, that is, till 2028-29.
- The cabinet also approved further investment of Rs 1,969 crore into the programme
- > The scheme aims to provide remunerative income to farmers for their agriculture residue, address environmental pollution, create local employment opportunities, and contribute to India's energy security and self-reliance.

#### Pradhan Mantri JI-VAN (Jaiv Indhan- Vatavaran Anukool fasal awashesh Nivaran) Yojana

- It was notified in March 2019.
- Financial Outlay: Rs. 1969.50 crore for the period 2018-19 to 2023-24.
- Financial Assistance: Rs. 150 crore per project for commercial projects and Rs. 15 crore per project for demonstration projects.



- Nodal Ministry: Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas
- Biofuels are renewable fuels derived from organic sources, such as plants, agricultural and forest residues, algae, and animal waste.
- Under the scheme, the first 2G Ethanol Project set up by Indian Oil Corporation Limited at Panipat, Haryana.
- The other 2G commercial projects being set up by BPCL, HPCL and NRL at Bargarh (Odisha), Bathinda (Punjab) and Numaligarh (Assam) respectively, are also nearing completion
- They are measured on scales called the
  - ✓ **Moment Magnitude Scale (MMS**), measures the movement of rock along the fault. It accurately measures larger earthquakes
  - ✓ **Richter scale** (magnitude scale) energy released 0-10.
  - ✓ Mercalli scale (The intensity scale) visible damage 1-12.
  - ✓ Earthquake waves: An earthquake generates seismic waves that penetrate the Earth as body waves (P & S) or travel as surface waves (Love and Rayleigh)
  - ✓ **P-waves** move faster and are the first to arrive at the surface. These are also called 'primary waves', similar to sound waves, travel through gaseous, liquid and solid materials
  - ✓ S-waves arrive at the surface with some time lag. These are called secondary waves, can travel only through solid materials.
  - ✓ The body waves interact with the surface rocks and generate a new set of waves called surface waves. (more destructive)

#### IN A FIRST, FOREST DEPT LAUNCHES LESSER FLORICAN CENSUS IN KUTCH

- ➤ Lesser Florican Census 2024: Gujarat Forest Department launched the first-ever census to estimate the population of lesser floricans in Kutch's grasslands.
- Area: Around 150 forest staff, NGO volunteers, and birdwatchers participated, covering areas like the Lala-Budiya Great Indian Bustard (GIB) Sanctuary and parts of Banni, one of Asia's largest grasslands.
- ➤ Significance: While population estimation of lesser floricans is regularly conducted in Blackbuck National Park (Velavadar), this is the first time it's being done in Kutch, which is unique for hosting three bustard species GIB, lesser floricans, and Houbara bustards together.

#### 8. NDMA TO MONITOR 189 HIGH-RISK GLACIAL LAKES TO PREVENT DISASTERS

- ➤ Following disasters inflicted by overflowing glacial lakes in the Himalayas, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has finalised a list of 189 "high-risk" glacial lakes for mitigation measures to reduce the risk emanating from them.
- ➤ The National Glacial Lake Outburst Floods Risk Mitigation Programme (NGRMP) was approved by the Centre.
- Glacial lakes are water bodies formed from melting glaciers.
- Glacial lake outburst floods (GLOFs) are sudden releases of water and sediment from lakes blocked by natural barriers like moraines or glacier ice.
- India has around 7,500 glacial lakes in the Himalayas,

#### 9. UN CHIEF ISSUES 'SOS' FOR PACIFIC ISLANDS WORST HIT BY WARMING OCEAN

- ➤ SOS Save Our Seas on rising sea levels
- ➤ United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said that ocean temperatures are rising in the Pacific Islands at three times the rate worldwide, and its population was "uniquely exposed" to the impact of rising sea levels.
- > The report released by the World Meteorological Organization showed ocean temperatures in the South West Pacific is increasing at up to three times the rate worldwide.
- ➤ The Pacific Islands can expect additional sea level rise of 15 cm (5.9 inches) by 2050 and 30 days a year of coastal flooding.
- ➤ A "loss and damage" fund to help poor nations cope with costly climate disasters was approved at last year's U.N. climate summit.


#### Loss and damage fund

- It was first announced during COP27 in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt.
- The formal agreement at the 19th Conference of the Parties (COP 19) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in Warsaw, Poland, in 2013, led to the establishment of the L&D fund.
- The World Bank will oversee the loss and damage fund in the beginning, with the source of funds being rich nations, such as the US, the UK and the EU, as well as some developing countries.

## 10. THE BALD IBIS, A BIRD SPECIES ONCE EXTINCT IN EUROPE, HAS NOW MADE A COMEBACK.

- ➤ The distinctive **northern bald ibis**, hunted essentially to extinction by the 17th century, was revived by breeding and rewilding efforts over the last two decades, from zero to almost 300.
- ➤ The feat moved the species from a "critically endangered" classification to "endangered"







#### 11. WHAT IS ALPKARAKUSH KYRGYZICUS?

- ➤ A new dinosaur species named Alpkarakush kyrgyzicus has been recently discovered, which walked the region of Kyrgyzstan in Central Asia around 165 million years ago.
- > It is a new species of large theropod dinosaur discovered
- ➤ Alpkarakush kyrgyzicus is also the first large Jurassic predatory dinosaur ever unearthed between central Europe and East Asia.
