1. INDIA FOURTH-LARGEST MILITARY SPENDER, OVERALL GLOBAL SPENDING ACCELERATES: SIPRI REPORT

- Latest report by Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI).
- India was the fourth largest military spender globally in 2023
- At \$83.6 billion, India's military expenditure was 4.2% higher than in 2022.
- Meanwhile, global military expenditure rose by 6.8% to \$2443 billion in 2023, the steepest annual rise since 2009
- > As per the report, the 10 largest spenders in 2023, led by the United States, China and Russia, all increased their
- The largest percentage increase in military spending by any country in 2023 was seen in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (+105%), where there has been protracted conflict between the government and non-state armed groups.
- South Sudan recorded the second largest percentage increase (+78 %) amid internal violence and spillover from the Sudanese civil war.

2. OVER 282 MILLION PEOPLE FACED ACUTE HUNGER IN 2023: UN REPORT

- According to the United Nations Global Report on Food Crises 2023, nearly 282 million people in 59 countries and territories suffered from acute hunger, an increase of **24 million** compared to 2022.
- > Three neighbouring countries of India Afghanistan, Bangladesh, and Pakistan, are among the top ten countries facing acute hunger.
- Acute hunger is different from chronic hunger. Chronic hunger occurs when a person is unable to consume enough food over an extended period to maintain a normal, active lifestyle.



3. SCO DEFENCE MINISTERS' MEETING IN KAZAKHSTAN ENDORSES 'ONE EARTH, ONE FAMILY, ONE FUTURE'

- Defence Secretary Giridhar Aramane participated in the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Defence Ministers' meeting in Astana, Kazakhstan on April 26, 2024.
- During the meeting, a protocol was signed by the Defence Ministers of all SCO Member States.
- The SCO Defence Ministers agreed, amongst other initiatives, to developing the idea of 'One Earth, One Family, One Future', which is rooted in the ancient Indian philosophy of 'VasudhaivaKutumbakam'.

- SCO is an intergovernmental political, economic, and security alliance
- Founded in 2001 by Kazakhstan, China, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Uzbekistan, and Tajikistan.
- Headquarter: Beijing, China
- The first summit was held in Shanghai, China, in 2001.

ITALIAN PM MELONI INVITES INDIA TO G7 SUMMIT MEETING IN JUNE 2024

- Italian Prime Minister Georgia Meloni has invited Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the Group of Seven (G7) Outreach session to be held in Borgo Egnazia, Apulia, Italy, from 13 to 15 June 2024.
- The 2024 G7 presidency is with **Italy.**

5. CHINA LAUNCHES SHENZHOU-18 CREW TO TIANGONG SPACE STATION

- > China's space program, the Shenzhou-18 mission saw the successful launch of a three-member crew aboard the Shenzhou-18 spacecraft.
- The mission's objective is to rendezvous with the Tiangong space station, marking another milestone in China's ambitious space exploration endeavors.
- > The Shenzhou-18 spacecraft, dubbed the "Divine Vessel," lifted off atop a Long March-2F rocket from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre.

6. OPENING CEREMONY OF FIRST GULF YOUTH GAMES TOOK PLACE AT DUBAI OPERA

- GCC Youth Games UAE 2024 opened at Dubai Opera (GCC Gulf Cooperation Council)
- Featuring 3,500 athletes competing in 24 sports with a focus on sustainability, unity, and youth.
- From April 16 to May 2.





- The theme, "Our Gulf is One... Our youth are promising."
- Participating nations UAE, Kuwait, Oman, Bahrain, Saudi Arabia and Qatar

7. IRAQ ENACTS HARSH ANTI-LGBT LEGISLATION: A BLOW TO HUMAN RIGHTS

- > Iraq's parliament recently passed a stringent law criminalizing same-sex relationships, imposing a maximum 15-year prison sentence.
- The legislation, titled the Law on Combating Prostitution and Homosexuality, reflects a concerning trend of increased scrutiny and persecution of LGBT individuals in Iraq.

8. IRAN UNVEILS KAMIKAZE DRONE SIMILAR TO RUSSIAN LANCET

- The Iranian Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) has introduced a new kamikaze drone resembling Russia's Lancet drone.
- This drone, yet to be named publicly, is designed for targeted attacks, akin to those witnessed in the Ukraine conflict.

9. DISCOVERY OF PLANET AS TWICE AS BIG AS EARTH

- ▶ Planet K2-18b which is more than twice as big as Earth and 120 light-years away sits within the habitable zone of its star in the Leo constellation.
- they'd detected dimethylsulphide gas in its atmosphere a compound that is 'only produced by life'
- > the James Webb Space Telescope will undertake hours of observations of the planet
- Investigations of planet K2-18b are being led by **Dr Nikku Madhusudhan**, an astrophysicist at the University of Cambridge.
- He's called it a 'hycean' world a relatively new term he coined for a rocky planet with a hydrogen-rich atmosphere and oceans of water.

10. SAUDI COMPANY ARAMCO TO SPONSOR FIFA WORLD CUP

- The world football governing body FIFA (Fédération Internationale de Football Association) announced a major sponsorship deal with the Saudi Arabian oil giant Aramco
- Under the FIFA deal, the Aramco company would sponsor multiple FIFA events, including the 2026 Men's World Cup and the 2027 Women's World Cup. The 2026 Men's World Cup will be co-hosted by Canada, the United States and Mexico. The host country for the Women's World Cup 2027 is yet to be decided.

11. FIRST 'ASEAN FUTURE FORUM'

- The ASEAN Future Forum (AFF) is an important initiative proposed by Prime Minister of Vietnam Pham Minh Chinh at the 43rd ASEAN Summit last September.
- AFF 2024 theme "Toward Fast and Sustainable Growth of a People-Centered ASEAN Community"
- > The forum is aimed at creating a common platform for ASEAN member states as well as partner countries to contribute to promoting and shaping the bloc's development path.
- EAM S Jaishankar also Speaks At First 'ASEAN Future Forum' Virtually

12. INDIA NEW POST OFFICE IN ANTARTICA

- Recently, the **BHARAT BRANCH POST OFFICE was inaugrated at bharti station in Antartica**. This marks **INDIA'S third post office to be established in antartica**.
- In 1984 first post office at DAKSHIN GANGOTRI
- IN 1990 a new post office branch was opened at maitri research station
- The letters meant for the post office in antartica are sent to the NATIONAL CENTRE FOR POLAR OCEAN RESEARCH (NCPOR), GOA
- India has three research stations in Antarctica, namely **Bharati, Dakshin Gangotri and Maitri.**

13. INC-4: NEGOTIATIONS ON A GLOBAL PLASTICS TREATY STARTED IN OTTAWA, CANADA

- > The fourth session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC-4) began in Ottawa, Canada.
- The committee is working towards developing an international legally binding instrument to address plastic pollution, including in the marine environment.
- INC-5 will take place in Busan, the Republic of Korea

14. 6TH EDITION OF INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON DISASTER RESILIENT INFRASTRUCTURE

- ➤ 6th edition of the International Conference on Disaster Resilient Infrastructure held on 24-25 April, 2024 in New Delhi
- PM Modi addressed via video conferencing.
- ➤ The Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure has seen impressive growth since its inception in 2019, it is now a global coalition of 39 countries and 7 organizations



15. AFTER BILLIONS OF YEARS FIRST TIME TWO LIFEFORMS MERGED INTO ONE

- > An international team of scientists has made a groundbreaking observation of an evolutionary event between a species of algae commonly found in the ocean and a bacterium.
- This event has led to the merger of the two lifeforms, resulting in a single organism.
- > This is the first time in at least a billion years that such an occurrence has been witnessed.

Endosymbiosis

- Primary endosymbiosis, a process that has only occurred twice in Earth's history, gave rise to complex life through mitochondria and plants.
- In this process, algae engulfed a bacterium and provided it with nutrients, energy, and protection, while the bacterium gave the algae the ability to "fix" nitrogen from the air. The bacterium became an internal organ, or organelle, vital to the host's function.

16. NEPAL HOSTS FIRST INTERNATIONAL RAINBOW TOURISM CONFERENCE

- > The single-day international conference was organised by Mayako Pahichan Nepal, a non-governmental organisation.
- > The conference's main objective is to position Nepal as an LGBT-friendly tourism destination.
- In June 2023, Nepal allowed same sex marriages to be registered legally

17. INDIA-KUWAIT RELATIONS STRENGTHENED WITH INAUGURAL HINDI RADIO BROADCAST

- > The Indian Embassy in Kuwait announced the launch of the first-ever Hindi radio broadcast in Kuwait, a significant step to deepen ties between the two nations.
- Initiated by Kuwait's Ministry of Information, the program will air every Sunday on FM 93.3 and AM 96.3, highlighting the bond between India and Kuwait.

18. US TO LAUNCH FIRST EVER IN-ORBIT MILITARY EXERCISE TO COMBAT SPACE THREATS (MISSIONVICTUS HEDGE)

- > The first-ever in-orbit combat drill will be soon conducted by the US military in preparation for potential battles outside
- > The Space System Command (SSC) will arrange the first of this technology by making history in the process.
- > Its goal is to get the US military ready for any combat that may arise outside Earth.
- It informed how two commercial space businesses have inked contracts with the Space Force for the 'Victus Hedge' mission, which is scheduled to be finished by the fall of 2025.

19. APPLE BECOMES THE FIRST COMPANY TO EXPORT IPHONES WORTH MORE THAN \$10 BILLION FROM INDIA /APPLE

- American company Apple exported a record \$10 billion worth of iPhones from India in 2023-24 under the Production Linked Incentive Scheme (PLI). This is almost double the export of last year.
- The iPhone export is the largest ever export of a single branded product by any company from India.
- Apple signed deals with three Taiwanese companies Foxconn Hon Hai, Pegatron and Wistron (now owned by Tata) as well as Korea's Samsung and India's FIH (a Foxconn company that makes devices other than iPhones).
- The only Indian company to manufacture iPhone in India is Wistron. Wistron Company was acquired by Tata Electronics in 2023. Tata Electronics is building Apple's largest assembly plant in Hosur, Tamil Nadu. It has an existing plant at Malur near Kolar in Karnataka.

20. NIGERIA BECOME 1ST COUNTRY TO ROLL OUT A VACCINE FOR MENINGITIS

- Nigeria has become the first country to administer the Men5CV/MenFive conjugate vaccine recommended by WHO, which protects from five strains of meningococcal bacteria.
- This vaccine called MenFive is used to prevent meningococcal disease caused by Neisseria meningitidis groups A, C, Y, W, and X in people aged 9 months to 85 years.
- The vaccine was developed by PATH and the Serum Institute of India through a 13-year partnership and with financial support from the UK government's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office

About Meningitis

- Meningitis is an infection that causes inflammation of the membranes that surround the brain and spinal cord. These membranes are called meninges.
- Meningitis can be caused by different types of bacteria, viruses, fungi, and parasites. Most infections can spread from one person to another, but some cases can be caused by injuries, cancer, or drugs.
- Bacterial meningitis is the most dangerous type of meningitis and can be fatal within 24 hours in any age group Meningitis can cause illness.
- Fortunately, there are effective treatments and vaccines available for some of the main bacterial causes of meningitis.

21. INDIRA GANDHI INTERNATIONAL (IGI) AIRPORT 10TH BUSIEST AIRPORT

- Airports Council International (ACI) World, a global organisation which measures and assesses airport standards ranked Delhi's IGI Airport as the 10th busiest airport in the world in 2023 with 7.22 crore passengers.
- From the top 10 rankings for total passenger traffic, five of the airports are in the United States.
- > The Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport in the United States held the top rank with 10.46 crore passengers.

24. PYOLJJI-1-2 AND HWASAL-1 RA-3: NORTH KOREA TESTS CRUISE MISSILE WARHEAD

> North Korea tested a "super-large" cruise missile warhead and a new anti-aircraft missile in a western coastal area

25. EUVICHOL-S: WHO APPROVES NEW ORAL CHOLERA VACCINE

- Cholera is an acute diarrhoeal infection caused by ingestion of food or water contaminated with the bacterium Vibrio cholerae.
- Euvichol-S has a similar efficacy to existing vaccines but a simplified formulation, allowing opportunities to rapidly increase production and supply which many communities battling with cholera outbreaks urgently need.
- Euvichol-S is produced by EuBiologicals Co. Ltd, Republic of Korea

26. BRIGHTON COUNCIL, ENGLAND, TO HONOUR INDIAN ARMY'S ROLE IN WORLD WARS

- > The **Brighton and Hove city council** in England has decided to hold an annual multi-faith event at the town's India Gate memorial this October to commemorate the role of Indian soldiers in the two World Wars.
- > The one-day event will be held at the India Gate in Brighton to pay tribute to the soldiers of the undivided India.
- Maharaja of Patiala Bhupender Singh unveiled the India Gate in Brighton on 26 October 1921.
- Edward Lutyens designed the 42-meter-high India Gate. In 1931, Viceroy Lord Irwin dedicated the monument to the nation.
- > The entire arch of the India Gate stands on a base made of red Bharatpur stone and rises in stages to a huge moulding.

27. SBI, ICICI & HDFC BANKS IN TOP 50 ASIA PACIFIC BANK: S& P GLOBAL

- > Three Indian banks, SBI, HDFC Bank and ICICI Bank, have been included in the top 50 banks of the Asia-Pacific region according to a report of S&P Global Market Intelligence.
- The list dominated by mainland Chinese banks **Industrial and Commercial Bank of China Ltd.**, **the world's largest bank** (**TOPS**) has been ranked based on their assets (loans).
- > SBI was ranked 20, HDFC Bank 33 and ICICI Bank 48 on the list.

28. INDIA DELIVERS FIRST BATCH OF BRAHMOS MISSILE SYSTEM TO PHILIPPINES

- India delivered first batch of BrahMos missiles to the Philippines on April 19, two years after signing a \$375 million deal.
- Indian Air Force transported missiles and launchers to the Philippines via military transport aircraft.
- BrahMos Aerospace Pvt Ltd, an India-Russian joint venture, produces supersonic cruise missiles.
- > BrahMos missile flies at a speed of 2.8 Mach, nearly three times the speed of sound.
- India seeks to expand defence ties with the Philippines amid concerns over China's military assertiveness in the South China Sea.

29. THOUSANDS DISPLACED BY 'MOUNT RUANG' ERUPTION IN INDONESIA

- > The first volcanic eruption occurred on the night of 16 April 2024 in 'Mount Ruang' located in North Sulawesi province of Indonesia.
- Four consecutive explosions occurred in this area. Due to this incident of volcanic eruption, clouds of smoke and ash covered the sky.

30. UNFPA REPORT: INDIA'S POPULATION TRENDS AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH INEQUITIES

- The United Nations Population Fund's (UNFPA) latest report, titled "Interwoven Lives, Threads of Hope: Ending Inequalities in Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights," sheds light on India's population dynamics and the persistent disparities in sexual and reproductive health.
- India leads globally with an estimated population of 144.17 crore, surpassing China.



The report reveals that India's population is expected to double in 77 years. Notably, 24% of India's population falls in the 0-14 age bracket, indicating a significant youth demographic.

31. UNCTAD AND IMF FORECASTS FOR INDIA'S GDP GROWTH IN 2024

- UNCTAD forecasts India's GDP growth at 6.5% in 2024, a slight deceleration from the previous year's 6.7%.
- This projection aligns with the IMF's revised forecast, attributing growth to strong public investment and the services sector
- IMF also revises its forecast to 6.8%, citing strong domestic demand.

The International Monetary Fund is a global multilateral development (MDB) bank established as a specialised agency of the United Nations on 27 December 1945. It formally started operating on 1 March 1947.

- The Bretton Woods Conference, also known as the United Nations Monetary and Financial Conference
- 44 countries, including India, participated in the conference the conference decided to establish the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD), which later became part of the World Bank group.
- India is a founder member of the IMF. India has the eighth largest quota-2.75% in the IMF. India has a voting share of 2.63% in the IMF.

- Member countries: 190

32. RAJIV GANDHI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT HYDERABAD RECEIVES SKYTRAX AWARD FOR 'BEST AIRPORT STAFF'

- > GMR Hyderabad International Airport Ltd (GHIAL) has been honored with the 'Best Airport Staff in India & South Asia 2024' award by Skytrax.
- Singapore's Changi Airport has lost its pole position as the world's best airport to Doha's Hamad International Airport, according to air transport rating firm SKYTRAX.
- This is the third time Hamad International Airport clinched the top spot, after winning the title in 2021 and 2022.
- > South Korea's Incheon International Airport rose to third place from No. 4 in 2023 and was named the world's most family-friendly airport for the year.
- > Tokyo's Haneda Airport came in fourth and was also named the "World's Cleanest Airport.

33. HIGH-LEVEL UKRAINE PEACE SUMMIT TO BE LED BY SWITZERLAND IN JUNE 2024

- > Switzerland announced on 11 April 2024 that it has proposed to host a conference at the level of the heads of state of Russia and Ukraine.
- > The objective of the summit is to create common understanding and a concrete roadmap for the peace process.
- India has also been invited to this peace conference to be held in Switzerland.

34. INDIA AMONG TOP MISMANAGED PLASTIC WASTE GENERATOR IN THE WORLD

- According to a recent report of Switzerland's non profit group **EA Earth Action**, India is among the top **twelve** countries in the world responsible for 60 percent of the planet's mismanaged plastic waste.
- The report **Plastic Overshoot Day** was released by EA Earth Action on 12 April 2024.
- Eritrea topped the Mismanaged Waste Index while Bermuda was at the bottom. The higher the rank of the country in the Index means greater waste mismanagement in the country.
- Mismanaged plastic waste refers to plastic that is not properly recycled, incinerated, or kept in sealed landfills. It is mainly thrown in the open, polluting soil, land, water or air.
- The per capita plastic waste production in India is lowest in the world. It was 8 kg per capita per year.
- India's expected mismanaged waste in 2024 will be 7.4 million tons, which is "very high".
- The report predicts that the Indian mismanaged plastic waste will be less than one-fifth of China and one-third of the US.



35. KRISTALINAGEORGIEVA RE-APPOINTED IMF MD FOR ANOTHER 5 YEARS TERM

- International Monetary Fund (IMF), KristalinaGeorgieva has been re-appointed as the Managing Director (MD) of the IMF for a new 5 year term.
- KristalinaGeorgieva's new term will start on 1 October 2024.

36. INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF MILLETS 2023: A RECAP

- The International Year of Millets (IYM) 2023, concluded with a closing ceremony held at the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) headquarters in Rome, Italy, on March 29th, 2024.
- United Nations General Assembly designated 2023 as the International Year of Millets following a proposal by India, supported by over 70 countries.
- > Millets offer solutions to food scarcity while promoting sustainable land restoration and biodiversity.
- Presenting India as the "Global Hub for Millets," as India produces onefifth of the world's millets
- Millets are a highly varied group of small-seeded grasses

37. ROMANIA AND BULGARIA PARTIALLY JOIN SCHENGEN TRAVEL ZONE

- Romania and Bulgaria have taken a significant step in their integration with the European Union by partially joining the Schengen travel zone
- **EU Commission President Ursula von der Leyen** describes the partial inclusion as a "huge success" and a "historic moment" for European integration
- Travelers arriving by air or sea from both countries now have unrestricted access to the Schengen zone.

38. WHO LAUNCHES 'COVINET', A GLOBAL LABORATORY TO MONITOR THE EMERGING CORONA VIRUS

- > It is a global network of laboratories to identify and monitor possible new coronaviruses that may emerge soon.
- ➤ It will assess other coronaviruses including SARS-CoV2, Corona virus and MERS-CoV with increased laboratory capacity.
- CoViNet is a network of global laboratories specializing in human, animal and environmental coronavirus surveillance.
- > The network currently includes **36 laboratories from 21 countries** in all 6 WHO regions.
- > Three Indian laboratories are also included in CoViNet.

39. GERMANY LEGALIZES RECREATIONAL CANNABIS

- Germany became the largest European Union (EU) nation to legalize recreational cannabis use, despite facing opposition from politicians and medical associations.
- > Under the new law, adults over 18 are now permitted to carry up to 25 grams of dried cannabis and cultivate up to three marijuana plants at home.
- Germany joins Malta and Luxembourg as countries with the most liberal cannabis laws in Europe.

40. KOREAN FUSION REACTOR 'ARTIFICIAL SUN' SETS NEW RECORD

- > South Korea have set a new world record using the Korea Superconducting Tokamak Advanced Research (KSTAR) device, an "artificial sun" nuclear fusion reactor.
- > They generated plasma temperatures of 100 million degrees Celsius for duration of 48 seconds.
- > The achieved temperature of 100 million degrees Celsius is a remarkable seven times hotter than the Sun's core.

41. ZIMBABWE'S PRESIDENT MNANGAGWA DECLARES NATIONAL DISASTER OVER DROUGHT

- ➤ Due to the El Nino-induced drought more than 80% of country received below normal rainfall
- The country needs \$2bn to tackle hunger caused by low rainfall which has wiped out about half of the maize crop.
- The grain shortage has pushed up food prices and an estimated 2.7 million people will face hunger.
- Neighbouring Zambia and Malawi have also recently declared states of disasters due to drought.
- The lack of rain induced by the El Nino global weather pattern has also affected electricity production, as Zimbabwe relies on hydroelectric power.



42. WORLD'S OLDEST MAN, CERTIFIED IN GUINNESS WORLD RECORD, PASSES AWAY. VENEZUELAN JUAN VICENTE PEREZ MORA

Venezuelan Juan Vicente Perez Mora, certified in 2022 by Guinness World Records as the oldest man in the world, died on at the age of 114.

43. NATO CELEBRATES 75 YEARS OF COLLECTIVE DEFENSE ON 4 APRIL

- The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) is marking its 75th anniversary this year. The alliance, founded in 1949, will hold a special event in Brussels
- NATO Secretary-General: Jens Stoltenberg;
- NATO Founded: 4 April 1949, Washington, D.C., United States
- > NATO Headquarters: Brussels, Belgium.

44. INDIA ABSTAINED ON VOTE CALLING FOR GAZA CEASEFIRE AT UNHRC

- India chose to abstain from voting on a resolution passed by the Human Rights Council.
- The resolution called for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and urged states to implement an arms embargo.
- The resolution was adopted by the 47-member Human Rights Council.



- India voted in favor of three resolutions that criticized Israel for human rights violations against Palestinians, Israel's occupation of Syrian Golan, and called for the Palestinian right to self-determination.
- India did not vote for a fourth resolution that condemned Israel's actions in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, which the US, Germany, and four other countries voted against. India, along with France and Japan, abstained from voting on this resolution.

45. A GIGANTIC OCEAN 700 KM UNDER THE EARTH DISCOVERED BY SCIENTISTS

- The scientific community has been buzzing about an incredible discovery recently a massive ocean hidden deep beneath the Earth's crust.
- This subterranean reservoir is located 700 kilometers below the surface of the Earth in a rock called ringwoodite.
- It is believed that the reservoir is three times the volume of all the Earth's surface oceans combined.
- The paper, titled 'Dehydration melting at the top of the lower mantle', explains how ringwoodite can absorb water due to its sponge-like structure. This mineral has a unique crystal structure that allows it to attract hydrogen and trap water.
- This discovery was made possible by using a network of 2000 seismographs across the United States.

46. CHINA IMPORTS MAXIMUM CRUDE OIL FROM RUSSIA, LEAVING INDIA BEHIND

- > Energy cargo tracker 'Vortexa' released its report in the first week of April 2024. According to this report, China has overtaken India as the primary importer of Russian crude oil through sea routes.
- > China imported 1.82 million barrels per day (bpd) of Russian crude oil by sea. This was more than India's 1.36 million
- Indian imports of Russian oil increased by 7 percent

BRITON, 'HARDEST GEEZER', BECOMES FIRST PERSON TO RUN ACROSS AFRICA

> British national Russ Cook, also known as the "Hardest Geezer", has successfully completed a challenge that took him more than 352 days to finish.

48. INDIA'S 2ND GLOBAL PORT IN SITTWE, MYANMAR

- > The Ministry of External Affairs has approved India Ports Global (IPGL) 'sproposal to take over the entire operation of the Sittwe port, located on the Kaladan River in the Rakhine province of Myanmar.
- Thus, the Sittwe port of Myanmar became the second international port after the ShahidBeheshti Port, Chabahar of Iran to come under the control of India Ports Global Limited.
- The port was built with a grant of \$ 500 million from India to Myanmar.
- The Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways and Ayush, ShriSarbanandaSonowalformally inaugurated the project on 9 May 2023. He received the first Indian cargo ship, which sailed from the Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port in Kolkata to the Sittwe Port.

49. QUTUBMINAR ILLUMINATES IN REMEMBRANCE OF RWANDA GENOCIDE OF 1994 / 1994

- > UN International Day of Reflection on the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda
- > The QutubMinar was lit up with the colours of the Rwandan national flag on April 7 in solidarity in remembrance of the 100-day massacre that claimed the lives of 8,00,000 people in 1994 in the Rwanda capital, Kigali.
- On this day in 1994, extremists from the Hutu ethnic group launched a 100-day killing spree, in which members of the Tutsi minority and Hutu moderates were slaughtered.

- According to the report, around 2.9 crore Indians were infected with hepatitis B infection and 0.55 crore with hepatitis C.
- The WHO released the report during the **World Hepatitis Summit**, which was held in **Lisbon**, Portugal.
- WHO has set a target of eliminating Hepatitis worldwide by 2030.

- The European Court of Human Rights (ECHR) in France has delivered a landmark ruling, finding that Switzerland's failure to adequately deal with the climate crisis constitutes a human rights violation.
- The Court ruled that Switzerland had "failed to comply with its duties under the Convention relating to climate change" and had violated the right to respect for private and family life

54. US. JAPAN ANNOUNCE PLANS TO SEND JAPANESE ASTRONAUT TO MOON

- > In a joint announcement, President Joe Biden and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida revealed that Japanese astronauts will join future NASA lunar missions as part of the Artemis program.
- This move is seen as a strategic effort to strengthen economic and defense ties between the United States and Japan.
- Two Japanese astronauts will join future NASA lunar missions, and one will become the first non-American ever to land on the moon

55. UK'S FIRST WOMAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO INDIA: LINDY CAMERON

- Lindy Cameron, a distinguished Oxford University alumna and former CEO of the UK's National Cyber Security Centre, has been appointed as the first woman high commissioner to India.
- Her appointment marks a significant milestone in UK-India relations; coming 70 years after India appointed its first high commissioner to London.

56. CITROEN MAKES HISTORIC MOVE: FIRST MNC TO EXPORT EVS FROM INDIA / CITROEN

- French automaker Citroën has become the first multinational car manufacturer to export electric vehicles (EVs) produced in India to the international market.
- The company announced the commencement of exports of its locally manufactured ë-C3, sending an initial shipment of 500 units to Indonesia from the Kamarajar Port.
- > The export of the e-C3 symbolizes the strength of Indo-French industrial cooperation and mutual commitment to cleaner mobility.

57. ISRAEL DEPLOYS C-DOME DEFENSE SYSTEM AGAINST AERIAL THREAT NEAR EILAT

- > Israel deployed its ship-mounted defense system, the C-Dome, for the first time against a suspicious aerial target near the southern city of Eilat.
- The incident occurred following an alert in the area, which had previously been targeted by missile fire from Yemen's
- The C-Dome defense system is the naval counterpart of the land-based Iron Dome. Developed by Rafael Advanced Defence Systems.

1. GREAT NICOBAR'S PARTICULARLY VULNERABLE TRIBAL GROUP, SHOMPEN, CAST THEIR VOTE FOR THE FIRST TIME

- For the first time, members of the **Shompen**, one of the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) in the country and who reside in the dense tropical rain forests of the **Great Nicobar Island**, took part in the election process by casting their votes in the Andaman and Nicobar Lok Sabha constituency.
- > Shompen is the only PVTG in the region with Mongoloid features, such as light brown to yellow brown skin and oblique eye features.
- ➤ The estimated population of Shompen was 229 as per the 2011 Census data.

PVTG:

- PVTGs are more vulnerable among the tribal groups.
- 1975, the Government of India declared 52 tribal groups as PVTGs on the recommendation of Dhebar commission.
- Currently, there are 75 PVTGs out of 705 Scheduled Tribes

Characteristics of PVTGs:

Population – stagnant/declining Technology – pre-agricultural Literacy Level – extremely low Economy – Subsistence level

2. VIZHINJAM PORT OF ADANI GROUP WILL RUN INDIA'S 1ST TRANS SHIPMENTS

- Adani Group's Vizhinjam Port in Kerala has received approval from the shipping ministry to operate as India's first transshipment port. This will be India's first full-fledged deepwater transshipment port.
- Transshipment ports are transit hubs where cargo from one ship is transferred to another on the way to its final destination.
- World's biggest Transshipment ports are Singapore, Shanghai, Shenzhen, Busan and Hong Kong.



3. SUPREME COURT UPHELD THE VALIDITY OF EVM IN ADR'S CASE

- > The **Supreme Court's** two-judge benches, including Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta have made a decision in the **'EVM case'** of **Association for Democratic Reforms vs Election Commission of India and Another.**
- > The petitioners argued that if EVMs were to continue, the Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) slip should be handed to the voter so that they could physically cast it into the ballot box, or all VVPAT slips in the country should be counted alongside the electronic tally.
- > They argued that the petitioners' request for a return to paper ballots revealed a lack of trust in the system. The court upheld the use of EVMs for recording and counting votes.

4. INDIA'S ECOMMERCE MARKET WILL BE WORLD'S THIRD LARGEST BY 2030

- Invest India has forecasted a bright future for India's e-commerce industry, predicting a massive surge to \$325 billion by 2030. This growth coincides with a digital economy expected to reach a staggering \$800 billion in the same timeframe
- The report suggests that this will happen due to the growth of the internet user base and the flourishing digital economy. According to the report, India is expected to have around 500 million online shoppers by 2030.

5. HITACHI PAYMENT SERVICES INTRODUCES UPGRADABLE ATMS IN INDIA

- ➤ Hitachi Payment Services has unveiled new upgradable ATMs in India, allowing banks to adapt their machines into Cash Recycling Machines (CRMs) as per evolving needs.
- Manufactured under the 'Make in India' initiative, these ATMs offer flexibility and efficiency to banks, potentially revolutionizing the Indian ATM industry.
- In addition to upgradable ATMs, Hitachi Payment Services previously introduced the first-of-its-kind UPI ATM on the Android platform for card-less cash withdrawals in September 2023.

RELIANCE JIO IS THE WORLD'S LARGEST MOBILE OPERATOR IN DATA TRAFFIC

Reliance Jio, a telecommunications company in India, has achieved a significant milestone by becoming the world's largest mobile operator in data traffic, surpassing China.



- The company revealed its quarterly results, which showed that the total traffic on the Jio network has reached 40.9 Exabytes, marking a 35.2 percent year-on-year increase.
- Additionally, Jio has a wide subscriber base of 481.8 million, making it a strong player in the industry.

7. 'ONE NATION, ONE AIRSPACE': INDIA'S PROJECT ISHAN

- In order to streamline and enhance air traffic management (ATM), India has initiated the process of consolidating its four airspace regions into a single entity spanning the entire nation -Indian Single Sky Harmonized Air Traffic Management (ISHAN) initiative, centered in Nagpur.
- > The Airports Authority of India (AAI) has called for expressions of interest to prepare a detailed project report for it
- Indian airspace is controlled through four flight information regions (FIRs) at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, and Chennai, and a sub-flight information region at Guwahati.



8. SJVN INAUGURATES FIRST MULTI-PURPOSE GREEN HYDROGEN PILOT PROJECT OF THE NATION

- > SJVN Limited has achieved a significant milestone with the inauguration of India's first Multi-purpose (Combined Heat & Power) Green Hydrogen Pilot Project at SJVN's 1,500 MW NathpaJhakri Hydro Power Station (NJHPS) in Jhakri, Himachal Pradesh.
- The green hydrogen produced from the project will be utilized for High Velocity Oxygen Fuel (HVOF) Coating Facility of NJHPS for meeting its combustion fuel requirements; it will also generate electricity through its fuel cell of 25 kW capacity.

SJVN Limited

- SJVN, formerly known as Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam, SJVN Limited, a Mini Ratna, Category-I and Schedule –'A' CPSE under the supervision of Ministry of Power.
- It is involved in hydroelectric power generation and transmission.
- It was incorporated in **1988 as NathpaJhakri Power Corporation**, a joint venture between the Government of India and the Government of Himachal Pradesh.

9. TAMIL NADU AND KERALA TO CONDUCT FIRST SYNCHRONISED NILGIRI TAHR CENSUS FROM APRIL 29

- > 'The Nilgiri Tahr' project was officially launched by Tamil Nadu CM MK Stalin in October 2023.
- Now, Tamil Nadu is all set to estimate the population of its State animal, in the first-ever synchronised census with Kerala Nilgiri Tahr (Nilgiritragushylocrius)
- IUCN Status: Endangered .
- Listed in Schedule I of the Wildlife (Protection) Act of India, 1972
- Habitat: Endemic to the Nilgiri Hills in parts of Tamil Nadu and Kerala.
- > The Nilgiri tahr is the state animal of Tamil Nadu.
- It inhabits montane grasslands and shola forests within the South Western Ghats.
- The largest population resides in Eravikulam National Park (Kerala)

10. INDIAN BANK & TATA SOLAR POWER TO FINANCE CENTRAL ROOFTOP SOLAR SCHEME

- > The Chennai-based public sector **Indian Bank** has signed an agreement with **Tata Power Solar Systems** to provide loans under the **PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana.**
- The Indian Bank will provide loans to customers to install rooftop solar systems on their houses.
- > Tata Power Solar Systems is a leading Indian company that installs rooftop solar power plants to generate electricity.

PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana

- The PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana is a central government scheme that Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched on 13 February 2024.
- The Scheme aims to provide free electricity to **one crore households** in India.
- Households can get **300 units of free electricity per month** by installing a rooftop solar electricity generating unit.
- The government of India has allocated Rs 75,021 crore for the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana.

11. INNOVATIVE 3D PRINTED DUMMY BALLOT UNIT UNVEILED BY IIT GUWAHATI

- The Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation Cell (SVEEP) of Kamrup Election District along with the Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati developed a 3D-printed dummy ballot unit to enhance voter awareness and engagement.
- > The purpose of creating a 3D-printed dummy ballot unit is to educate people, particularly new voters and senior citizens, about the complexities of the voting process and alleviate any fears, concerns or doubts they may have. By providing a practical experience, the dummy ballot unit aims to encourage greater voter turnout.

SVEEP

- > SVEEP is a programme launched by the Election Commission of India. It aims to educate and spread awareness among the citizens, electors, and voters regarding the electoral process.
- This programme is designed to fulfill the needs of different states based on their socio-economic, cultural, and demographic profile as well as their history of electoral participation.

12. FIRST BJP CANDIDATE EVER TO WIN LS POLL UNOPPOSED: MUKESH DALAL

- Mukesh Dalal, a candidate from the BJP, recently won the Lok Sabha election without any opposition. This is the first time in the last 12 years that a candidate has won an election unopposed.
- Mr. Dalal's victory from the **Surat parliamentary constituency** is also believed to be the first time a candidate from the BJP has won a parliamentary poll **without any opposition**.

13. PAYU GETS RBI'S IN-PRINCIPLE APPROVAL TO OPERATE AS PAYMENTS AGGREGATOR

- PayU, a digital financial services provider had received in-principle authorisation from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to operate as a Payments Aggregator (PA) under the Payment Settlements Act, 2007.
- A payment aggregator is a third-party service provider that enables customers to make and businesses to accept payments online
- > PayU is a Netherlands-based payment service provider to online merchants. The company was founded in 2002.

14. GOVERNMENT ALLIES WITH SBI CARD AND TELCOS TO TACKLE OTP FRAUDS

- The Ministry of Home Affairs, SBI Cards and Payment Services Ltd. (SBI Card) and telecom companies are partnering up to create a solution for notifying users about stolen OTP (onetime passwords).
- > This initiative forms part of a larger strategy to tackle the increasing menace of cyber fraud and phishing attacks within the banking sector.

15. CHIEF ELECTORAL OFFICER'S OFFICE OF HARYANA LAUNCHES 'VOTERS-IN QUEUE' APP FOR INFORMATION ON QUEUES AT POLLING CENTRES

- ➤ The app has been launched with the target of achieving at least 75 percent voting in the Lok Sabha elections as compared to the 70 percent voting in the previous Lok Sabha elections.
- > The 'Voter-In-Queue' app will be operational in 30 urban assembly constituencies

16. KARNATAKA AND GUJARAT LEAD INDIA'S CLEAN ENERGY TRANSITION: REPORT

- > Institute for Energy Economics and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) and Ember evaluates the progress of India's clean electricity transition at the state level.
- While **Karnataka and Gujarat maintain strong performances**, states like Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal, and Uttar Pradesh lag behind, necessitating increased efforts for renewable energy integration and decarbonization.

17. PASSPORT AFFORDABILITY RANKINGS: INDIAN PASSPORT SECOND CHEAPEST, UAE TOPS

- A recent study conducted by **Australian firm Compare the Market AU** has revealed intriguing insights into global passport affordability and accessibility.
- According to the study, the **Indian passport ranks as the second cheapest worldwide**, with the UAE passport claiming the top spot for affordability.
- While the Indian passport offers a cost-effective option in terms of both acquisitions cost and yearly expenses, its visa-free access is relatively limited compared to higher-priced passports.

18. CANCEROUS ETHYLENE OXIDE CONTAMINATION IN INDIAN SPICE BRANDS

- Hong Kong & Singapore recently banned several spice variants manufactured by MDH and one (Fish Curry Masala) by Everest Food Products.
- > The decision came after authorities reportedly found the presence of the cancer-causing **pesticide ethylene oxide in** the spice mixes.
- The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has commissioned quality checks on MDH and Everest products.

19. INSV TARINI RETURNS TRIUMPHANT AFTER HISTORIC TRANSOCEANIC EXPEDITION

- > The Indian Naval Sailing Vessel (INSV) Tarini has returned triumphant to her base port at Goa after a historic transoceanic expedition of nearly two months duration.
- The expedition was Flagged off from Goa on 28 Feb 24. After 22 days of navigating through the Indian Ocean, INSV Tarini arrived at Port Louis, Mauritius, and then back to Goa.
- > It marks a historic milestone as they become the first from India to accomplish such a feat.

20. NATIONAL FERTILIZERS GETS NAVRATNA STATUS

- National Fertilizers Ltd made a significant announcement, revealing that it has achieved "Navratna" status, as granted by the Department of Public Enterprise.
- > This designation is reserved for top-performing Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and grants them enhanced autonomy and financial powers.

21. BARANASI'S TRICOLOUR BARFI AND DHALUA IDOL METALCRAFT GET GI TAG

- > Tiranga Barfi of Varanasi, associated with India's independence on 16 April 2024, has been given the status of GI product. Besides, another product of Varanasi, Dhalua Murti Metal Casting Craft, has also been included in the GI category.
- After this tag, these products of Varanasi will now get a special identity in the world. In this way, a total of 34 products in Banaras region and 75 products in Uttar Pradesh have now received the GI tag. Kashi is also called the most diverse GI city.



22. ON VANDE BHARAT PLATFORM INDIA TO UNVEIL 250 MPH BULLET TRAIN

- India is preparing to launch an indigenous bullet train that will reach speeds of more than 250 kilometres per hour (km/h).
- India is currently relying on Japanese technology for the bullet trains that will operate on the Ahmedabad to Mumbai line, the Vande Bharat trains will utilize more Indian tech and domestic manufacturing
- The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) is providing a soft loan of approximately Rs 40,000 crore for the Mumbai-Ahmedabad High Speed Rail project, which has a total project cost of more than Rs 1.08 lakh crore.

23. ALIA, SAKSHI MALIK NAMED IN TIME'S LIST OF 100 MOST INFLUENTIAL PEOPLE

- > Time magazine has released the list of 100 most influential personalities of the world.
- In this list, along with various well-known personalities of the world, many famous personalities of India were included. Actor Alia Bhatt and wrestler Sakshi Malik are prominently involved in this.



24. J&K HIGH COURT UPHOLDS RULE OF LAW, QUASHES DETENTION UNDER PUBLIC SAFETY ACT

- > The Jammu and Kashmir High Court has quashed the detention of Jaffar Ahmad Parray under the Public Safety Act.
- > Justice Rahul Bharti emphasized that India operates under the rule of law, asserting that citizens cannot be detained without proper legal grounds.

25. SANY INDIA LAUNCH OF ITS FULLY ELECTRIC DUMP TRUCK

- Sany India, a leading manufacturer of mining and construction equipment, has launched the SKT105E Electric Dump Truck.
- SKT105E becomes the first locally manufactured electric off-highway dump truck, paving the way for a more environmentally conscious and cost-effective future.

26. INDIAN NAVY SEIZES 940KG DRUGS IN ARABIAN SEA IN 1ST INTERDICTION AS CMF MEMBER

- > INS Talwar, in support of the Canadian-led Combined Task Force (CTF) 150, conducted its first drug interdiction since becoming a member of combined by Maritime Forces (CMF) in November 2023.
- > CMF is the world's largest international naval partnership (43-nations) upholding the international rules-based order by promoting security and stability across 3.2 million square miles of water

27. DUE TO DROUGHT & INTENSE HEAT, LAKSHMANA TIRTHA RIVER DRIED UP

The Lakshmana Tirtha River, located in the Kodagu District, Karnataka, is well-known for its picturesque hills, dense forests, and crystal-clear rivers. However, due to ongoing severe drought conditions and intense heat, the river is facing an acute water crisis.

The flow of the Cauvery River, another important water source in the district, has dwindled and as a result the Lakshmana Tirtha river has completely dried up.

28. GOVERNMENT NOTIFIES 100% FDI IN SPACE SECTOR

FDI in the Space Sector

- The notified FDI in the space sector allows
- 74 per cent FDI in satellite manufacturing and data products under the automatic routes,
- 49 per cent for the satellite launch vehicles and spaceports, and
- 100 per cent for manufacturing components required by the space sector.
- India's share of the global space economy is around 2 to 3 per cent. The government plans to increase it to more than 10 per cent by 2030.

29. PERMANENT EDUCATION NUMBER (PEN) REQUIRED FOR STUDENTS STARTING ACADEMIC YEAR 2024-25

- To simplify and streamline the process of students' transition from one school to another, the School Education Department in the state has made the use of **Permanent Education Number (PEN)** mandatory from the academic year 2024-25.
- PEN is a unique identification number assigned to every student by the **Union Ministry of Education**, through the **UDISE+ (Unified District Information System for Education Plus)** portal, which covers more than 14.89 lakh schools, 95 lakh teachers, and 26.5 crore children.



30. HINDUSTAN ZINC LIMITED BECOMES WORLD'S THIRD-LARGEST SILVER PRODUCER

- Hindustan Zinc Limited, a Vedanta group company, became the **third-largest silver producer globally**, according to the World Silver Survey 2024 conducted by 'The Silver Institute', USA.
- The survey also mentioned the company's **Sindesar Khurd Mine** was now the world's second-largest silver-producing mine, moving up from last year's fourth position.
- Mexico-based Fresnillo is the world's largest silver producer. It has silver and gold mining operations across Mexico. Fresnillo produced 53.5 million ounce silver in 2023, 5% year-on-year growth.
- Polish miner KGHM Polska Miedz is the second-largest producer of silver in the world. It produced 45.9 million ounce in 2023, an 8% increase from the previous year.

31. INTERGLOBE TO BRING AIR TAXIS IN 2026

- InterGlobe Enterprises, which owns India's largest airline IndiGo, will launch an all-electric air taxi service in India from Delhi's Connaught Place to Haryana's Gurugram by 2026.
- > In November 2023, InterGlobe Enterprises entered into a deal with Archer Aviation to supply 200 eVTOL aircraft
- > The electric vertical takeoff and landing (eVTOL) aircraft can carry the pilot in addition to four passengers.

32. 100TH YEAR OF VIAKOM SATYAGRAHA

- > Vaikom Satyagraha, the non-violent agitation against untouchability in Kerala lasted for 603 days
- It was held for the right of backward communities to travel through the public road leading to VaikomMahadeva Temple at Kottayam district in Kerala (Travancore Kingdom).
- The Satyagraha started on the 30th of March 1924 and ended on the 23rd of November 1925.

33. MP TOPS IN IMPLEMENTING THE CENTRE'S GREEN CREDIT PROGRAMME (GCP)

- Madhya Pradesh is leading in implementing the Green Credit Programme (GCP) of the Centre. The GCP has approved the plantation of trees in over 500 land parcels, covering 4,980 hectares across 10 states in the past two months.
- MP reported the highest area of approved degraded forest land for plantation or greening exercises, followed by Telangana, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, and Assam
 - The Green Credit Programme (GCP) is a new market-based mechanism that aims to encourage voluntary environmental actions across various sectors.

34. 1ST GLASS SKYWALK BRIDGE OF UP IS READY TO OPEN IN CHITRAKOOT

- > The enchanting Tulsi (Shabari) waterfall in Chitrakoot is now home to the first glass skywalk bridge in Uttar Pradesh.
- The awe-inspiring bridge, fashioned to resemble Lord Rama's bow and arrow, was constructed in the Kodand forest area at a cost of Rs 3.70 crore.
- Other Skywalks of India Sikkim Skywalk ,Glass Bridge In Rajgir, Bihar,Wayanad Glass Bridge In Thollayiram Kandi, Kerala

35. INTRODUCING CDP-SURAKSHA: REVOLUTIONIZING HORTICULTURE SUBSIDIES / CDP-SURAKSHA

- The Indian government has launched CDP-SURAKSHA, a groundbreaking digital platform aimed at streamlining the distribution of subsidies to horticulture farmers under the Cluster Development Programme (CDP)
- > CDP-SURAKSHA, which stands for "System for Unified Resource Allocation, Knowledge, and Secure Horticulture Assistance," is designed to ensure swift subsidy disbursal to farmers' bank accounts via the e-RUPI voucher system provided by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)

36. PROBA-3 MISSION OF ESA TO STUDY SUN WILL BE LAUNCHED BY ISRO

- In a remarkable display of cutting-edge space technology, India is set to launch the European Space Agency's (ESA) revolutionary Proba-3 mission in September 2024.
- > This groundbreaking mission is set to achieve a world-first in precision formation flying, using two satellites that have been designed to operate together in perfect unison, forming a 'large rigid structure' amidst the vastness of space.
- > Two satellites will work together to create a 144-meter long instrument known as a solar coronagraph. This will help scientists to study the Sun's corona which is difficult to observe due to the brightness of the solar disk.
- India sent a solar mission into space on September 2, 2023. It took around 127 days and travelled about 1.5 million kilometers to reach its final destination.

37. ISRO AIMS TO MAKE SPACE MISSIONS DEBRIS FREE BY 2030

- Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO)
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) was set up by the government of India on 15 August 1969.
- ➤ ISRO was earlier known as the Indian National Committee for Space Research (INCOSPAR), which was set up by the Government of India in 1962.
- ➤ ISRO is involved in science, engineering and technology to use the benefits of outer space for India and mankind.
- ► ISRO comes under the Department of Space (DOS), Government of India.
- Vikram Sarabhai the founder of ISRO was its first chairman.

38. MAHINDRA SUSTEN'S ₹1,200 CRORE HYBRID RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECT IN MAHARASHTRA

- Mahindra susten, a subsidiary of the mahindra group, enters the hybrid renewable energy sector with a ₹1,200-crore project in Maharashtra, combining 101 MW wind and 52 MW solar capacities.
- > The project aims to generate 460 million kWh of clean energy and offset 420,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions.



39. GOVERNMENT TO ESTABLISH COTTON TEST LABS IN 6 STATES FOR KASTURI COTTON

- The union government is planning to set up dedicated labs for testing high-grade cotton in Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Haryana, Punjab, Gujarat and Karnataka as part of a push to establish the Indian Kasturi cotton as a global brand
- The labs would be set up in convergence with the Bureau of Indian Standards' (BIS) testing facilities
- India aims to compete with global cotton brands such as Supima and Giza, which are known for their exceptional softness, strength and durability
- > While India has only recently branded its cotton despite being a major producer with the largest area under the crop

40. RAJIV GAUBA TO HEAD CENTRAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE ON LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY

- The government of India has set up a committee on LGBTQ+ communities' welfare headed by Union Home Secretary Rajiv Gauba.
- > The committee has been set up by the government on the suggestion of the Supreme Court in the Supriyo Chakraborty vs Union of India Case.
- In the Supriyo Chakraborty vs. Union of India Case 2023, the Special Marriage Act of 1954 was challenged because it did not permit same-sex marriage.
- > The plaintiffs argued that this was against Article 14 of the fundamental rights, which provides for equal protection of law.

41. INDIA'S OLDEST AIR FORCE PILOT DALIP SINGH MAJITHIA PASSES AWAY

The country's **oldest fighter pilot and entrepreneur, Squadron Leader Sardar Dalip Singh Majithia,** passed away at the age of 103.



- However, candidates need to disclose information about property that is of substantial value or reflects a luxurious lifestyle.
- a voter had no absolute right to know about each and every asset of a candidate and that a candidate had the right to privacy regarding matters irrelevant to his/her candidature.
- A Bench of Justices Aniruddha Bose and Sanjay Kumar said a candidate's choice to retain his privacy on matters which were of no concern to the voters or were irrelevant to his can

were of no concern to the voters or were irrelevant to his candidature for public office did not amount to a 'corrupt practice' under Section 123 of the Representation of People Act, 1951.



Representation of People Act, 1951

- The Act was introduced following the adoption of the Constitution of India in 1950 to lay down specific procedures and rules for the conduct of elections, which are fundamental to the democratic governance of the country.
- The Representation of the People Act, 1951, along with the other laws governing elections, work in conjunction with the constitutional provisions to ensure the integrity of the electoral process in India.

44. WORLD'S LARGEST RENEWABLE ENERGY PARK BEING BUILT IN GUJARAT

- Adani Group Company 'Adani Green Energy Limited' is building the world's largest renewable energy park in Khavda in Kutch district of Gujarat.

- GeM ended this financial year with a gross merchandise value (GMV) of over Rs 4 lakh crore.
- GEM Launched in August 2016.

49. CBI RAISING DAY- CJI WILL DELIVER 20TH D. P. KOHLI MEMORIAL LECTURE

- > The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) is hosting the 20th D. P. Kohli Memorial Lecture to commemorate the Raising Day (1 April) of the Investigation Agency.
- Chief Justice of India, Justice D. Y. Chandrachud, will deliver the lecture on the theme of "Adopting Technology to Advance Criminal Justice" at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi.
- Kohli headed the Delhi Special Police Establishment DSPE in 1955 to curb corruption in public services. He continued as the Director of CBI from its inception in 1963 until 1968.
- The CBI is not a statutory body, but it derives its power to investigate from the DSPE Act.
- The beginning of the establishment was initiated by the Santhanam Committee from 1962-1964.

50. TN GOVERNOR R.N. RAVI INAUGURATES PARAM VIR CHAKRA GARDEN

- > Tamil Nadu Governor R.N. Ravi inaugurated Param Vir Chakra garden and Aikyam exhibition in the KanchiMahaswamiVidyaMandir in Tambaram

51. PARADIP PORT, THE TOP CARGO-HANDLING PORT IN INDIA IN 2023-24

- > The Paradip Port Authority, Odisha, has displaced the Deendayal Port Authority, Kandla, as the top cargo-handling major port of India in 2023-24
- In 2023-24, the Paradip Port handled 145.38 Million Metric Tons (MMT) of cargo.
- The Paradip Port achieved the **highest productivity** among all major ports in India.
- Paradip Port is the cheapest in terms of tariff among all the ports in the country

52. ONE VEHICLE, ONE FASTAG' NORM IMPLEMENTED

- > The National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has introduced the 'One Vehicle, One FASTag' norm, which aims to prevent the use of a single FASTag for multiple vehicles or linking multiple FASTags to a particular vehicle
- This new norm has come into effect from April 1, 2024.
- "Multiple FASTags won't work... People who have multiple FASTags for one vehicle won't be able to use all of them from today (April 1)
- FASTag is an electronic toll collection system operated by NHAI in India.
- It utilizes Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology for making toll payments directly from a linked prepaid or savings account

53. EC ROPES IN AYUSHMANN KHURRANA TO URGE YOUTH TO VOTE

- > The Election Commission of India (ECI) has roped in popular actor Ayushmann Khurrana to encourage the youth to exercise their franchise in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections

54. INDIA'S NUCLEAR ENERGY ROADMAP: 1 LAKH MW BY 2047

- The Digi Yatra is a biometric-enabled system that uses facial recognition technology to establish the passengers' identities and link them to their boarding passes.
- It automates the entry and verification of passengers at airport checkpoints, such as security, entry, and boarding
- Digi Yatra reduces waiting lines, quickens processing times, and simplifies procedures for the passengers.

56. INDIA TO ESTABLISH FIRST PRIVATELY MANAGED STRATEGIC PETROLEUM RESERVE BY 2029-30

India is embarking on establishing its first privately managed strategic petroleum reserve (SPR) by 2029-30.



This initiative aims to allow the operator the liberty to trade all stored oil, aligning with models seen in countries such as Japan and South Korea

57. MANSUKHMANDAVIYA: INDIA TO STOP IMPORTING UREA BY END OF 2025

- According to the Union Minister for Chemicals and Fertilizers, **MansukhMandaviya**, India will stop importing urea by the **end of 2025** due to an increase in local production capacity with the commissioning of new fertilizer plants.
- India is a big importer of Urea and meets around 30% of its 35 million tonnes of annual urea requirement from imports.

- > NGT Chairman Justice PrakashShrivastava



Science & Technology

April 2024

1. SPACE TESTING HUB SET UP BY DRDO FOR INDIAN NAVY INAUGURATED IN KERALA

A state-of-the-art Submersible Platform for Acoustic Characterization and Evaluation (SPACE) was inaugurated by Secretary of Defence (R&D) and Chairman of DRDO Dr Samir V Kamat at the Underwater Acoustic Research Facility, Kulamavu, in Idukki, Kerala.

The Naval Physical & Oceanographic Laboratory of DRDO set up the SPACE.

This facility is a center for testing and evaluating sonar systems used by the Indian Navy on different types of vessels, including ships, submarines, and helicopters.

2. DRDO DEVELOPS LIGHTEST BULLET PROOF JACKET OF COUNTRY

- DRDO's Defence Materials and Stores Research and Development Establishment (DMSRDE), Kanpur has successfully developed the lightest Bullet Proof Jacket in the country
- For protection against 7.62 x 54 R API (Level 6 of BIS 17051) ammunition.
- Army soldiers would no longer be in danger of being killed by AK-47 and sniper rifle fire from a distance of ten meters of the enemy during any operation.
- > Recently, this bullet proof jacket was successfully tested at Terminal Ballistics Research Laboratory (TBRL), Chandigarh

KAIST RESEARCHERS DEVELOP HIGH-POWER, FAST-CHARGING SODIUM-ION BATTERY

- In a potential breakthrough, South Korean researchers from Korea Advanced Institute of Science & Technology (KAIST) have developed a high-power hybrid sodium-ion battery that can be charged in seconds.
- Sodium is nearly 1000 times more abundant than lithium
- > So sodium-ion electrochemical energy storage would be a cheaper and potentially more feasible source of energy.

4. INDIA TESTS CRYSTAL MAZE 2, AIR-LAUNCHED MEDIUM RANGE BALLISTIC MISSILE

- > India's Strategic Forces Command has successfully tested a new model of its Medium-Range Ballistic Missile, Crystal Maze 2
- > This missile is believed to be the Crystal Maze 2, also known as ROCKS, of Israeli origin.
- The missile has a range of over 250 kilometers and was launched from a Su-30 MKI fighter jet in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- > The Indian Air Force recently tested an air-launched ballistic missile, significantly boosting its capabilities.

5. RAZORPAY PARTNERED WITH AIRTEL PAYMENTS BANK, LAUNCHED 'UPI SWITCH'

- For faster, smoother transactions.
- It has enhanced transaction success rates by 4-5% and can handle up to 10,000 TPS, addressing peak time demands.

6. INDIAN STUDENTS SHINE AT NASA'S HUMAN EXPLORATION ROVER CHALLENGE

- Two Indian student teams have brought laurels to the country by winning prestigious awards at the NASA Human Exploration Rover Challenge (HERC).
- The KIET Group of Institutions from Delhi-NCR bagged the "Crash and Burn" award, while the Kanakia International School from Mumbai received the "Rookie of the Year" award.

NASA'S SOLAR-POWERED SPACECRAFT: PIONEERING SOLAR SAIL TECHNOLOGY

- NASA recently launched a groundbreaking space mission from New Zealand, deploying the Advanced Composite Solar Sail System spacecraft aboard Rocket Lab's Electron rocket.
- This innovative spacecraft utilizes solar energy for propulsion, marking a significant leap in space exploration technology.
- The primary objective of the mission is to demonstrate the effectiveness of solar sail propulsion, paving the way for future missions with reduced reliance on heavy propulsion systems

8. NASA ANNOUNCED TO SEND 'DRAGONFLY ROTORCRAFT MISSION' TO SATURN'S MOON TITAN BY THE YEAR 2028

- NASA has confirmed its **Dragonfly rotorcraft mission** to Saturn's **organic-rich moon Titan**.
- In early 2023, the mission successfully passed all the success criteria of its initial design review.
- The car-sized Dragonfly, being built by the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Laboratory (APL) in Laurel, Maryland, is to be nuclear powered.
- Using data obtained by **NASA's Cassini spacecraft**, scientists discovered that Saturn's moon Titan contains lakes of liquid methane.
- > Titan and Earth are the two places in the Solar System where liquids have been found on the surface.



- > ISRO's satellite images of catchments of Indian Himalayan river basins over the past 40 years have shown a significant expansion of glacial lakes.
- The **Gepang Gath glacial lake (Indus River Basin)** at an elevation of 4,068 m in Himachal Pradesh has witnessed a long-term change, with its size increasing by 178% from 36.49 to 101.30 hectares between 1989 and 2022.
- > ISRO has flagged that the rate of increase is approximately 1.96 hectares per year.
- The Himalayan Mountains, known as the Third Pole because of their extensive glaciers and snow cover, are highly sensitive to changes in the global climate.
- Foliation Glacial lakes are expanding, which poses significant risks to communities downstream. Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOFs) can occur as a result, which are sudden and severe floods caused by the release of large volumes of melt water from glacial lakes due to the failure of natural dams made of moraine or ice.
- A glacial lake is a body of water that forms at the foot, on, in, or under a glacier. As global warming continues, glaciers are shrinking, increasing freshwater output to glacial lakes.

10. INDIAN NAVY CONDUCTED AN EXTENSIVE EXERCISE 'POORVI LEHER'

- ➤ The exercise 'Poorvi Leher' was conducted along the East Coast on 20 April 2024.
- The exercise was aimed at validating procedures for assessing the Indian Navy's preparedness to meet maritime security challenges in the region.
- > This was conducted under the Operational Control of the Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Eastern Naval Command.

11. DRDO DELIVERS 1ST BATCH OF INDIGENOUS PARTS FOR LCA TEJAS MK1A TO HAL

- The **Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO)** handed over the first batch of indigenous **Leading Edge**Actuators and Airbrake Control Module for LCA Tejas MK1A to Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL).
- > It has been handed over to HAL by DRDO's Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA). This is an important achievement towards self-reliance in aeronautical technologies.
- ► HAL, Lucknow has already made preparations for production of these to meet the existing order of 83 Light Combat Aircraft Tejas MK1A.

12. OUTBREAK OF BIRD FLU IN KERALA AS WHO WARNS ABOUT H5N1 VARIANT

Thousands of ducks in the Edathua and Cheruthana in the Kuttanad region of the Alappuzha district of Kerala have been infected by the highly pathogenic Avian Influenza H5N1.

Bird Flu

- Avian influenza, also known as 'bird flu', is a disease primarily affecting birds and is caused by a virus of the **Orthomyxoviridae family**.
- H5N1 virus is a subtype of influenza type A that causes a highly infectious, severe respiratory disease in birds called avian influenza (or "bird flu").

13. META UNVEILS UPGRADED AI ASSISTANT POWERED BY LLAMA 3

- Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg has announced the launch of the company's advanced AI assistant, Meta AI, powered by the state-of-the-art language model Llama 3.
- The new AI offering is designed to **enhance the user experience across Meta's popular apps**, including WhatsApp, Instagram, Facebook, and Messenger, while also being available on a dedicated website, meta.ai.

14. KERALA TO INTRODUCE SOPS UNDER ONE HEALTH INITIATIVE

- One Health project is currently being implemented as part of the World Bank-aided Rebuild Kerala project in four districts of the State Alappuzha, Pathanamthitta, Kottayam, and Idukki
- SOPs will cover at least 8 diseases like Hepatitis A and E, dengue, Nipah, and Avian influenza. Aimed at early disease surveillance and prevention, these SOPs were developed at a two-day workshop by the Centre for One Health, Kerala. The initiative targets robust outbreak investigation and control mechanisms at district levels.
- > This is perhaps for the first time that infectious diseases outbreak investigation guidelines are being prepared at the State-level on the One Health platform.

15. IISC, BENGALURU DEVELOPS HYDROGEL TO REMOVE MICROPLASTICS FROM WATER

- Scientists at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru have created a sustainable hydrogel to tackle the problem of plastic pollution.
- > The hydrogel has a unique polymer network that can bind and destroy microplastics found in water using UV light radiation.
- \triangleright The hydrogel was found to be highly efficient it could remove approximately 95% and 93% of two different types of microplastics in water at nearly neutral pH (\sim 6.5).
- Microplastics are tiny plastic particles less than 5 millimeters in size and have spread all over the planet, from oceans to mountains. These tiny particles can enter our body through the water we drink, posing a serious threat to our health.

16. WORLD'S FIRST 'MISS AI' BEAUTY PAGEANT ANNOUNCED FEATURING AI JUDGES

- > The competition is being held by the World AI Creator Awards (WAIC) and aims to recognise the achievements of AI creators around the world.
- > The pageant will be judged by a panel of four members, including two AI influencers, Aitana Lopez and Emily Pellegrini.
- Artificial Intelligence (AI) was developed in the 1950s. The father of AI, John McCarthy, defined it as the intelligence displayed by machines.



- India's top refiner Indian Oil Corp entered a pact with Panasonic Energy to form a joint venture to manufacture lithium-ion cells in India
- Lithium-ion batteries, which power electric vehicles (EV) and are used to store energy, are expected to play a major role in India's goal to be a net zero emitter of greenhouse gases by 2070.
- The country is expected to see sales of more than 10 million EVs a year by 2030, according to an annual Economic Survey.

18. DRDO CONDUCTED FLIGHT-TEST OF INDIGENOUS TECHNOLOGY CRUISE MISSILE

- > The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) recently conducted a successful flight test of the Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile (ITCM) from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) located at Chandipur, off the coast of Odisha.
- These included radar, an electro-optical tracking system (EOTS), and telemetry deployed by ITR at different locations to ensure complete coverage of tahe missile's flight path. The missile's flight was also monitored from the Su-30-Mk-I aircraft of the Indian Air Force.
- The missile has been developed by the Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE), a laboratory based in Bengaluru, along with other Indian industries and laboratories.
- > It has a range of approximately 1500 kilometers and can carry 24 different types of warheads that weigh between 200 and 300 kilograms, depending on the mission's requirements.

19. GENERAL MANOJ PANDE INAUGURATES HIGH-TECH IT LAB AT ACADEMY OF ARMED FORCES IN UZBEKISTAN

- During his visit to Uzbekistan from April 15-18, 2024, Chief of the Army Staff, General Manoj Pande, marked a significant milestone in bilateral defense cooperation between India and Uzbekistan by inaugurating a state-of-the-art IT Laboratory at the Uzbek Academy of Armed Forces.
- > This initiative stems from a commitment made during the Defence Ministers' meeting in September 2018, highlighting the growing partnership between the two nations.

20. AFMS AND IIT KANPUR PARTNER FOR SOLDIER HEALTH TECH IN TOUGH TERRAINS

- > The Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur for collaborative research and training.
- AFMS and IIT Kanpur will work together for better health of soldiers in remote areas
- Under this, research will be done and new technology will be developed to deal with the health problems faced by soldiers in inaccessible areas.

21. 'DUSTLIK 2024' JOINT MILITARY EXERCISE BETWEEN INDIA AND UZBEKISTAN

- > The 5th edition of the 'Dustlik' joint military exercise between India and Uzbekistan will take place in the Termez district of Uzbekistan starting from April 15.
- Exercise Dustlik 2024 is the 5th edition of the joint military exercise 'DUSTLIK' between India and Uzbekistan.
- Indian and Uzbekistan armed forces joined for a training programmeto enhance cooperation and future military ties.

- India's first private sector built earth observation satellite TSAT-1A, has been launched by Tata Advanced System Limited, a subsidiary company of Tata Son's.
- Till date only the government of India's owned Indian Space Research Observation (ISRO) had the capability to build and launch such satellites.
- The satellite is considered to be a military grade.
- The TSAT-1A was launched on board the SpaceX Falcon 9 Rocket launched from the Kennedy Space Center, Florida, and United States.
- The TSAT-1A satellite has been built by Tata Advanced Systems in collaboration with the Satellogiccompany of the **United States of America.**
- TSAT-1A has been assembled in TASI's Assembly, Integration and Testing ("AIT") plant at its Vemagal facility in Karnataka.

25. AI SUPERCOMPUTER 'STARGATE': \$100 BILLION PLAN OF MICROSOFT AND CHATGPT

- According to reports, Microsoft and OpenAI are collaborating on a massive data centre project that could potentially cost up to \$100 billion.
- The project aims to develop an artificial intelligence supercomputer called "Stargate."
- Other companies such as Google, Baidu, and Meta are also developing their own competitive products, including Bard, Ernie Bot, and LLaMA.

26. WORLD'S MOST POWERFUL MRI SCANS FIRST IMAGES OF HUMAN BRAIN

- Iseult', the world's most powerful Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) machine
- > The magnetic field created by the scanner is a whopping 11.7 teslas, a unit of measurement named after inventor Nikola Tesla.
- It can scan images with 10 times more precision than the common MRIs, whose power does not normally exceed 3
- > The machine design is the result of two decades of research by a partnership between French and German engineers.

27. NASA TO CREATE LUNAR TIME STANDARD

- > The White House has directed NASA to create a "Coordinated Lunar Time" or or the "Lunar Standard Time" for the Moon by the end of 2026, as governments and private companies increasingly compete in space.
- The European Space Agency in 2023 had announced similar plans to give the Moon its own time

28. INDIA'S FIRST GENE THERAPY FOR CANCER LAUNCHED

- The President of India, SmtDroupadiMurmu, launched India's first home-grown gene therapy for cancer at IIT Bombay.
- This groundbreaking treatment, called 'CAR-T cell therapy', is a major breakthrough in the battle against cancer.
- shining example of the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India) campaign

29. WORLD'S FIRST CONVERSATIONAL AI WITH EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

- Hume, a New York-based research lab, unveiled the first emotionally intelligent conversational AI named Empathic Voice Interface (EVI). It utilizes live audio input, returning both audio and transcripts with vocal expression measures.
- Powered by an empathic large language model (eLLM), it understands tones and word emphasis, optimizing human-AI conversations.]
- Trained on human reactions, EVI learns from users to enhance positive expressions.
- By analyzing speech nuances, it can determine when to speak and generate empathic language

30. ROMANIA UNVEILS WORLD'S MOST POWERFUL LASER

- A research center in Romania has revealed the world's most potent laser, based on the groundbreaking inventions of Nobel Physics Prize winners Gerard Mourou and Donna Strickland.
- > The laser, operated by the French company Thales, promises revolutionary applications across sectors from healthcare to space exploration
- > The heart of this groundbreaking laser lies in Chirped-Pulse Amplification (CPA) technology, developed by Mourou and Strickland.
- > This technique enables the amplification of laser power while maintaining safe intensity levels.

31. LARGEST DIGITAL CAMERA ON EARTH, READY FOR ITS COSMIC PHOTOSHOOT

- > Scientists are on the verge of exploring the greatest mysteries of the universe using a powerful new tool, the Legacy Survey of Space and Time (LSST) camera.
- This camera, funded by the US Department of Energy's Office of Science, boasts a record-breaking 3,200 megapixels, designed to capture unprecedented detail of the cosmos and shed light on elusive dark matter and dark energy.
- The LSST camera represents a significant leap in astronomical technology, as it is capable of capturing images of dark matter, which despite comprising most of the universe's mass, remains invisible to current instruments.
- The Vera C Rubin Observatory, located in a remote area of Chile, will soon be equipped with the LSST camera, which provides an unobstructed view of the southern sky.

32. AGNI-PRIME MISSILE HAS BEEN SUCCESSFULLY FLIGHT-TESTED IN ODISHA



- Strategic Forces Command (SFC), along with Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), conducted the successful flight-test of New Generation Ballistic Missile Agni-Prime from Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Island off the coast of Odisha.
- Agni-Prime met all the trial objectives **validating its reliable performance.**

Agni-Prime Missile

- Agni-Prime is a medium-range nuclear capable ballistic missile that will have a range of 1000 km to 2000 km.
- Agni-P is a new generation, an advanced variant of the Agni class of missiles
- Agni-P will **replace the Prithvi, Agni-1, and Agni-2 ballistic missiles** that were built two decades ago with technologies now considered outdated.
- Agni-P has been developed specifically for nuclear strikes against targets in Pakistan.
- Last month, India successfully carried out the first flight test of indigenously developed nuclear capable Agni-5 missile with multiple independently targetable re-entry vehicles (MIRV).

33. CHANDRAYAAN 3 TEAM OF ISRO RECEIVES JOHN L JACK SWIGERTJR AWARD

- India's premier national space agency, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Chandrayaan -3 mission team was awarded the 2024 John L "Jack" Swigert, Jr, Award for Space Exploration by the US-based Space Foundation.
- This award is given by the **US-based non-profit organisation Space Foundation to honour a space agency, company, or consortium of organisations in the realm of space exploration and discovery**
- > The Indian Consul General of India in Houston, **D C Manjunath**, received the 2024 John L "Jack" Swigert, Jr, Award for Space Exploration Award on behalf of the ISRO's Chandrayaan -3 team

34. CHANDRAYAAN-4: ISRO CHIEF SOMANATH SHARES PLANS FOR NEXT MOON MISSION IN 2040

- ➤ Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) chief S Somanath has revealed that the upcoming phase of the Chandrayaan project is in progress, aiming to advance India's lunar exploration efforts.
- He indicated that Chandrayaan-4 marks the initial stride towards India's aspiration of landing an astronaut on the **moon** by 2040.

35. BREAKTHROUGH IN HEALTHCARE: IIT JODHPUR UNVEILS NANO-SENSOR FOR DISEASE TRACKING

- Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology Jodhpur (IIT Jodhpur) have unveiled a groundbreaking nano-sensor designed to swiftly detect Cytokines, vital proteins regulating various cellular functions.
- This innovation aims to combat the high mortality rates resulting from delayed diagnoses and the absence of early warnings in disease progression
- The nano-sensor is seamlessly integrated with **artificial intelligence (AI)**, facilitating swift and accurate data processing and analysis

36. INDIAN ARMY CONDUCTS ANTI-TANK GUIDED MISSILE TRAINING EXERCISE IN SIKKIM

- The Trishakti Corps of the Indian Army executed a rigorous Anti-Tank Guided Missile (ATGM) exercise in Sikkim, operating at an altitude of 17,000 feet.
- > The exercise reaffirmed the strategic objective of "Ek Missile Ek Tank" while highlighting the accuracy and efficiency of ATGM systems

1. INDIAN NAVY RESCUE IRANIAN VESSEL AL KAMBAR UNDER OPERATION SANKALP

The Indian Navy rescued an Iranian fishing vessel **AI Kambar'** and its **crew of 23 Pakistani nationals**, in the Indian Ocean which was hijacked by armed pirates under its **Operation Sankalp**.

2. IAF'S 'GAGAN SHAKTI-2024' 10-DAY MEGA EXERCISE

- The Indian Air Force (IAF) is going to conduct the country's largest air military exercise in the name of 'Gagan Shakti-2024'.
- All the Air Force stations of the country will participate in the ten-day 'Gagan Shakti-2024' exercise.
- Maneuvers will be held in the field firing range of Pokaran
- ➢ 'Gagan Shakti Abhyas' takes place every five years

ACCORDING TO SATELLITE BASED PHOTOS, CHINA BUILT A SECRET SUBMARINE BASE IN BANGLADESH

- > China has built a submarine base in Bangladesh. It has been named BNS Sheikh Hasina.
- > The construction of the submarine base being built in Bangladesh with the help of China is almost complete.

4. INDIA, MALDIVES & SRI LANKA'S 'DOSTI-16' HELD IN MALDIVES

- ➤ Highlighting the importance of "collaboration and interoperability" among the coast guards personnel of the Maldives, India, and Sri Lanka, Maldivian Defence Minister Mohamed GhassanMaumoon said the trilateral exercise 'Dosti' will unite the troika to address "shared maritime security concerns through collaboration."
- Indian Coast Guard ships Samarth and Abhinav, along with Sri Lanka Naval Ship Samudura, are participating in the exercise 'DOSTI-16', while Bangladesh is participating as an observer.
- > Sri Lanka has described 'Dosti' as a trilateral exercise that aims to enhance cooperation, strengthen friendship, improve mutual operational capability, and develop interoperability among the Coast Guard personnel of India, the Maldives, and Sri Lanka.

5. RECORD GROWTH IN INDIAN DEFENCE EXPORTS: A MILESTONE ACHIEVEMENT

- The Ministry of Defence (MoD) announced that India's defence exports surged to a record Rs 21,083 crore in the fiscal year 2023-24, marking a remarkable growth of 32.5% from the previous year
- This achievement is attributed to the concerted efforts of both the private sector and Defence Public Sector Undertakings (DPSUs)
- > The Ministry credited policy reforms and 'Ease of Doing Business' initiatives for fostering an enabling environment for defence exports.

6. 'AKASHTEER' DEPLOYED TO STRENGTHEN ARMY'S AIR DEFENCE

- The Army inducted 'Akashteer Command and Control System' into the Air Defence Corps of the Indian Army to strengthen air defence security. The Army has prepared this air defence system to meet new challenges.
- > The first batch of Akashteerwas flagged off for air defence control centers from the Ghaziabad facility of Bharat Electronics Limited (BHEL). It has been developed as part of the Self-reliant India initiative.
- > The Army has declared the year 2024 as the 'Year of Technological Absorption'. The Indian Army is accelerating the induction of specific technologies and systems.

7. DRDO INITIATES PROJECT FOR TEST CENTRE IN WEST BENGAL

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has commenced a project in **Junput village**, **West Bengal**, to establish a test centre for the country's weapon systems.
- > This initiative aims to address the saturation of testing activities at Odisha's Chandipur Integrated Test Range (ITR) by providing an additional operational area.
- > The proposed test centre in Junput has received approvals from both the central and state governments, including the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

8. PHILIPPINES TO HOLD JOINT NAVAL DRILLS WITH U.S., JAPAN, AUSTRALIA

- > To counter China's expanding influence in the Asia-Pacific region.
- China stakes claim to 90% of the South China Sea, and this claim is based on the U-shaped nine-dash line etched on map in the 1940s by a Chinese geographer.
- > US, Australia & Southeast Asian countries rejected China's maritime claims over the South China Sea

South China Sea

- The South China Sea is bordered by China and Taiwan to the north, the Indo-Chinese peninsula (including Vietnam, Thailand, Malaysia, and Singapore) to the west, Indonesia and Brunei to the south, and the Philippines to the east (referred to as the West Philippine Sea).
- It is connected by the Taiwan Strait with the East China Sea
- The Luzon Strait with the Philippine Sea (both marginal seas of the Pacific Ocean).

9. 'PARIVARTANCHINTAN', A TRI-SERVICE CONFERENCE BY DEFENCE MINISTRY

- ParivartanChintan, a pioneering Tri-Service Conference aimed at generating new and fresh ideas, initiatives and reforms to achieve enhanced jointness and integration among the army, navy, and air force
- A day long discussions will be chaired by Chief of Defence Staff, General Anil Chauhan.
- The 'Chintan' will be the first-ever conference of the heads of all tri-services institutions, the Department of Military Affairs (DMA), Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) and the three services

10. INS SHARDA AWARDED 'ON THE SPOT UNIT CITATION' FOR ANTI PIRACY OPERATIONS / INS

- Admiral R Hari Kumar, Chief of the Naval Staff, during his visit to Southern Naval Command, Kochi, awarded 'On the Spot Unit Citation' to INS Sharda for successful conduct of antipiracy operations.
- ➤ The ship was involved in the safe release of all 19 crew members (11 Iranian & 08 Pakistani) of Iranian fishing vessel Omari which was held hostage by pirates off East coast of Somalia.

- > The first Director General of the Indian Coast Guard was Vice-Admiral V.A. Kamath.

12. SAGARKAVACH 2024: COASTAL SECURITY EXERCISE IN LAKSHADWEEP ISLANDS

- A two-day coastal security exercise called SagarKavach 01/24 was conducted off the Lakshadweep Islands
- The exercise involved the participation of all maritime security agencies, including the **Indian Navy, Indian Coast Guard,**Marine Police, Fisheries, Customs, and other security agencies.
- The primary objective of the exercise was to validate the effectiveness of the coastal security mechanism in dealing with asymmetric threats emanating from the sea.

13. INDIA RECEIVES FRESH BATCH OF IGLA-S AIR DEFENCE SYSTEM FROM RUSSIA, TO BE DEPLOYED AT LAC

- Indian Army received 24 Igla-S Man Portable Air Defence Systems (MANPADS), which were accompanied by 100 missiles.
- > The rest of these systems will be made in India through Transfer of Technology (ToT) from Russia.
- This procurement aims to enhance the Army's Very Short Range Air Defence (VSHORAD) capabilities, particularly in high mountainous terrain along the northern border.

Igla-S

- It is a man-portable air defence system (MANPADS) developed by Russia.
- It is known in the West as SA-24 Grinch.
- It entered service with the Russian Army in 2004.
- It has the capability of bringing down low-flying aircraft. It can also identify and neutralise air targets, such as cruise missiles and drones.
- It has an effective range upto 6 km.
- The limiting altitude of effective target destruction for the "Igla-S" complex is 3.5 km.

About Kathak Dance

- The government of India recognises Kathak as one of eight classical dance forms. The other classical dance forms are Bharatnatyam(Tamil Nadu), Kuchipudi (Andhra Pradesh), Odissi (Odisha), Manipuri (Manipur), Sattriya (Assam), Kuchipudi, and Mohiniyattam from Kerala.
- Kathak originated in North India and was later enriched by the Mughals.
- It is the only classical dance form which has been enriched by Muslim culture.
- Wajid Ali Shah, the last Nawab of Oudh (Awadh), founded the **Lucknow** gharana of Kathak. The other gharanas of Kathak are **Jaipur** and **Benaras.**
- The most famous exponent of Kathak is Birju Maharaj.

1. FOOD WASTE INDEX REPORT 2024

- Households across the globe wasted over **one billion meals** a day in 2022, even **as 783 million people struggled with** hunger and a third of humanity faced food insecurity,
- According to the Food Waste Index Report 2024, a study jointly authored by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and WRAP (Waste and Resources Action Programme), a U.K.-based non-profit
- > The report, released ahead of the International Day of Zero Waste (March 30), noted that in 2022, there were 1.05 billion tonnes of food waste generated (including inedible parts), amounting to 132 kilograms per capita and almost one-fifth of all food available to consumers.
- At present, only four G-20 countries (Australia, Japan, U.K., U.S) and the European Union have food waste estimates suitable for tracking progress to 2030.

2. LANCET STUDY EXPECTED GLOBAL LIFE EXPECTANCY UP 6.2 YEARS SINCE 1990

- According to a Lancet study, people worldwide are living more than six years longer on average in 2021 than they did in 1990.
- > The study also showed that life expectancy in India has increased by nearly eight years in the past three decades.
- **Bhutan has biggest life expectancy gain** of 13.6 years, followed by Bangladesh with a gain of 13.3 years, Nepal with 10.4 years and Pakistan with a modest increase of 2.5 years

3. THE CARBON MAJORS REPORT BY INFLUENCEMAP

- Report by non-profit think tank InfluenceMap.
- From 2016 to 2022, 80% of the world's CO2 emissions can be traced to a group of just 57 fossil fuels and cement producing companies.
- > The world's top three CO2-emitting companies in the period were Saudi Arabian state-owned oil firm Saudi Aramco, Russia's state-owned energy giant Gazprom and Indian state-owned producer Coal India.
- The report found most companies had expanded their fossil fuel production since 2015, the year when nearly all countries signed the U.N. Paris Agreement, committing to take action to curb climate change.
- Global energy-related CO2 emissions hit a record high last year," the International Energy Agency

U.N. Paris Agreement

- The Paris Agreement is a **legally binding international treaty** on climate change. It was **adopted by 196 Parties** at the **UN Climate Change Conference (COP21)** in Paris, France, on 12 December 2015. It entered into force on 4 November 2016.
- Its overarching goal is to hold "the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels" and pursue efforts "to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels."

4. UNICORNS WORLDWIDE: INDIA RANKS THIRD WITH 67 UNICORNS, US HAS 703, CHINA HAS 340

- India in 2023 had 67 unicorns, which is one less than 68 such startups last year, according to the latest **Hurun Global Unicorn Index.**
- ➤ The US led the list with 703 unicorns, up 37 from 2022, and China woth 340 unicorns.
- UK and EU ranked No 4 and No 5 in the list, respectively.

- 1. <u>Jawaharlal Nehru University</u> has made a big stride in the global rankings, debuting at **number 20 (for Development Studies)** and becoming India's highest-ranked university in the QS World University Rankings 2024 by Subject.
- 2. <u>Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Ahmedabad</u> (at 22nd position globally) is among the top 25 institutions around the globe for **business and management studies**. This is India's second highest-ranked University by a subject.
- 3. Saveetha Institute of Medical and Technical Sciences (SIMATS), Chennai, grabbed the 24th position globally for dentistry studies.

About National Security Guard (NSG):

- NSG was established in 1984.
- The National Security Guard was established as an anti-terrorism unit. NSG came into existence by an Act of Parliament 'National Security Guard Act, 1986'.
- The idea of setting up NSG came in 1984 after Operation Blue Star, the attack on Akshardham temple and the assassination of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.
- The main objective of establishing NSG has been to protect the states from internal disturbances and to combat terrorist activities.
- NSG works under the Home Ministry. It has two complementary elements:
 - ✓ First, the Special Action Group (SAG)
 - ✓ Second, the Special Ranger Group (SRG)
- The head of the NSG is designated as the Director General (DG). It is selected and appointed by the Home Minister.
- NSG's motto: 'SarvatraSarvottam Suraksha'.

2. NARSINGH YADAV ELECTED PRESIDENT OF WFI ATHLETE PANEL

- Former Commonwealth Games gold medalist Narsingh Pancham Yadav was elected the Chairman of the Athletes Commission of the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI).
- > WFI governs wrestling in India. The headquarters of WFI is located in New Delhi.

INTELLIGENCE BUREAU

IB is an internal intelligence agency of India that is used to gather intelligence from within India and also execute counter-intelligence and counter-terrorism tasks.

- Vasuki, named after the snake king associated with the Hindu deity Shiva, rivals in size another huge prehistoric snake called **Titanoboa**, whose fossils were discovered in a **coal mine in northern Colombia**, as announced in 2009.

6. ARCHAEOLOGISTS UNEARTH LEAD COIN HOARD FROM IKSHVAKU PERIOD IN PHANIGIRI, SURYAPET

- Officials of the Department of Archaeology and Museums have unearthed a coin hoard at the Phanigiri Buddhist site in Suryapet district, Telangana.
- The team led by N. Sagar, the excavation director found an earthen pot with 3,730 lead coins with elephant symbol on one side and Ujjain symbol on the other side.
- > The coins belong to the Ikshvaku period dated between 3rd century and 4th century Common Era.

Ikshvaku period

- The dynasty ruled in the eastern Krishna River valley of India, from their capital at Vijayapuri (modern Nagarjunakonda in Andhra Pradesh) during approximately 3rd and 4th centuries CE.
- The Ikshvakus are also known as the Andhra Ikshvakus or Ikshvakus of Vijayapuri
- The Ikshvaku kings were Shaivites and performed Vedic rites, but Buddhism also flourished during their reign.
- Several Ikshvaku queens and princes contributed to the construction of the Buddhist monuments at present-day Nagarjunakonda.

- Assam's Products
- Assamese BihuDhol: The two-faced drum is an iconic instrument in Assam's folk culture, played with both a stick and hand.
- Assamese Jaapi: Tokou Pat and a traditional bamboo hat made of densely woven bamboo or cane are a symbol of pride in Assam and were historically used for protection from sun and rain.
- Sarthebari Metal Craft: The handicraft industry from Barpeta, known for its bell-metal products, engages around 2000 artisans.
- Panimeteka Craft (Water Hyacinth): This product, made from water hyacinth, has gained recognition.
- MisingTaat (Handloom): Handwoven textiles made by the Mising community play a significant role in Assamese culture.
- Asharikandi's Exquisite Terracotta Works: The beautiful terracotta creations from Asharikandi are an essential part of Assamese cultural heritage.
- > These products represent the cultural heritage of the Bodos and include a variety of items, such as **Jotha, Gongona, Gamsa, Sifung, Serja, Khardwi, Kham, GongarDunjia, Thorka, Keradapini, Jwmgra, Dokhona, and Eri Silk.** These GI tags cover both agricultural products and musical instruments.

- > Three traditional products from Tripura have recently received the prestigious Geographical Indication (GI) tag.

11. 17 INDIANS STRANDED ON ISRAELI SHIP CAPTURED BY IRAN

- > Iran's Navy had captured an Israeli ship coming towards India in the Gulf of Oman near the Strait of Hormuz.
- > There were 17 Indians on board this ship as crew members. All of which are now under the control of Iranian officials.
- India urges both sides to return to diplomacy

12. INDIAN OCEAN OBSERVING SYSTEM OF INDIA AND US WILL REACTIVATE

India and the US plan to restart the Indian Ocean Observing System (IndOOS), a network of 36 buoys stationed in the high seas. These buoys will collect detailed data on ocean and atmospheric conditions to help improve weather forecasts.

13. WORLD CYBERCRIME INDEX UNVEILED: RUSSIA AND UKRAINE TOP LIST

- According to the World Cyber Crime Index recently published in PLoS One journal and prepared under the leadership of Oxford University, Russia and Ukraine have been ranked first and second respectively with respect to cyber crime.
- > The results highlight the concentration of cybercriminal activity in selected countries, with China, Russia, Ukraine, the United States, Romania and Nigeria consistently in the top 10 across all categories.
- India secures the 10th position, scoring notably in impact, professionalism, and technical skills.
- China and the United States closely follow, showcasing their prominence in cybercriminal activities.

14. INDIA OVERTAKES CHINA IN DIGITAL SERVICES EXPORTS: KEY FINDINGS FROM WTO REPORT

- In 2023, India emerged as a frontrunner in digital services exports, surpassing China, as outlined in the World Trade Organisation (WTO) report.
- The report highlights significant growth in digitally delivered services globally, with India's exports reaching \$257 billion, marking a 17 percent increase from the previous year.
- > This growth outpaced that of Germany and China, which registered only 4 percent each.

15. 105 YEARS OF JALLIANWALABAGH MASSACRE

- The Amritsar Massacre, also known as the JallianwalaBagh Massacre, remains one of the darkest episodes in India's struggle for independence.
- On April 13, 1919, General Dyer ordered his soldiers to open fire on an unarmed gathering in JallianwalaBagh, Amritsar, leading to hundreds of deaths and injuries.
- In 2024, India observes 105th anniversary of the JallianwalaBagh Massacre which serves as a poignant reminder of the sacrifices made in the pursuit of freedom
